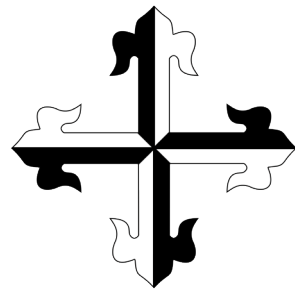

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Second Sunday of Easter



In 1955, Fr. János Brenner was ordained a priest in Hungary during the Soviet occupation. After ordination, Fr. Brenner was appointed to be a chaplain at Rábakéthely. He was an outstanding young priest and was greatly admired and loved by his people, especially the youth and young adults who he attracted. This, of course, drew the attention of the anti-Catholic Communist regime. Several attempts were made to assassinate the young priest. However, on a dark December night in 1957, Fr. Brenner received a false report that someone was dying and needed to be anointed and receive Confession and Holy Communion. The young man, carrying Holy Communion and Holy Oils, went out into the darkness, but on the way, he was attacked and stabbed thirty-two times. He was found dead the next day still clutching the Eucharist in his hands, he was just twenty-six years old. The brutal regime hoped to quash his influence, but instead his example became a model for young Hungarian Catholics to become more determined to resist. On May 1, 2018, Fr. Brenner was beatified by Pope Francis and declared a martyr. I guess we could say he went out into the darkness, but the darkness didn't overcome him.

Human history is full of examples of both clergy and laity being martyred for the practice of their faith. Tyrannical governments, whether monarchs, emperors, revolutionaries, politically right or left, can't stand the idea that someone would express loyalty to another authority, even if that authority is God, or His Church. To give your heart to another thought, ideal, way, is anathema to such forms of leadership or ideologies. It is not unusual for attempts, by law or by fear, to endeavor to intimidate priests so they won't carry out their sacred ministry or prevent the laity from practicing the sacraments or attending Mass or even believing in the Gospel.

After the execution and death of Jesus, the apostles hid themselves away because they were afraid. They were afraid that the authorities might come looking for them also, or that someone in the crowd might denounce them as one of "His" followers. They might also have been afraid because now, suddenly, after three years of following and hoping, they were without a leader. Whatever ideas, dreams, hopes and visions they may have had about their future were wiped out. Now they were in hiding, and they were afraid. In fact, they seem to have been paralyzed with fear. They couldn't decide to go forward, or go back to where they came from, to the lives they once lived.

Into this room of terror comes the Lord and He says to them, "peace be with you." Then He says to them, "don't be afraid." After this, He gives them their marching orders. They are to go into the world and change it into the Kingdom of God. Regardless of the fear, they have a mission to carry out.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED

People have lots of fears, some real and others irrational. Today, it seems, there is fear everywhere. Often people who share the values of Jesus, His vision and belief in Him as Lord, feel like they have been forced to hide away and be silent. There is definitely an attempt to intimidate and alienate us and silence our message and curtail our living of the Gospel. Fear can be crippling, and it can prevent us from living our life and moving forward. This fear can prevent us from speaking up, living as we want and as we know we should; it can prevent us from doing the right and the good thing. This sort of fear is existential fear – a fear of being who we are called to be and of doing what God sent us into the world to do. There can be no peace in our soul, heart, or lives, if we give into this sort of fear. Just as He said to the apostles in the upper room, Jesus says to us: "Don't be afraid."

It's time to look into our hearts, look over our lives, and ask ourselves if we are who we should be and have we done what God asks us to do. Then, having asked these questions, and been honest in our answers, it's time to decide to make a difference and to move out of our hiding place and change – change ourselves and change our world. Fear or no fear, I think I would rather live and die for something rather than simply exist quietly under some ideology that others would try to impose on me.

Don't be afraid; go into the whole world and build the Kingdom of God.

**SUPPORT YOUR CATHOLIC SCHOOL
RECEIVE AN OHIO TAX CREDIT**

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO).

In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial-need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Supporting students and their formation through Catholic Education, is a great way to share our blessings and faith with younger generations. The CEF-SGO may now allow for Catholic Education supporters to be able to receive a tax credit for their generosity.

Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750.00 per donor (up to \$1,500.00 if married and filing jointly). (See section 5747.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.)

PLEASE NOTE: According to a representative from the Ohio Department of Taxation, if you file a married joint return, each taxpayer will need to make their own \$750.00 contribution to claim the maximum of \$1,500.00. Separate acknowledgement letters will be provided for documentation of your gifts.

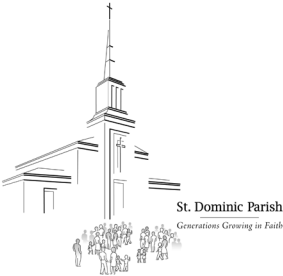
HOW TO GIVE TO THE SGO: You can make a gift online at CatholicBestChoice.org/SGO or by sending in a check to Catholic Education Foundation-SGO, 100 E. Eighth Street Cincinnati, Ohio 45202.
