We do Holy Week well here at St. Dominic. The liturgies on Holy Thursday and Good Friday are especially meaningful because those who are present have made a deliberate choice to be there. I hope you will make the celebration of Holy Week a priority this year. How you choose to spend your time this week will let you know what your priorities are. We will be gathering on Holy Thursday night, Good Friday afternoon and evening, Saturday night for the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday. These gatherings are central to who we are as a community of faith, celebrations of Jesus Christ and the events that saved us and raised us up to eternal life!

Here are some reflection questions that I find helpful each Holy week. You might want to use them in your prayer this week.

Thursday

Whose feet am I being called to wash? What is Jesus' word to me personally in the Eucharist today? What is my word to Him?

Friday

What is Jesus' word to me personally from the cross today?

What is my word to Him?

What is my cross at this time in my life?

How is God saving me through it?

Saturday/Sunday

How have I experienced new life through death?

To what new life is God inviting me today?

What needs to die first?

May this holiest week of the year be a time of grace for our parish and for each one of you! May our grieving families find comfort, hope, and peace in the resurrection of Jesus Christ!

Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.
