



ANNUAL REPORT

2023 Fiscal Year Report
from October 1, 2022-September 30, 2023.

The members of St. Dominic Parish were amazingly generous to the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and in turn, the St. Vincent de Paul Society was generous to our neighbors.

The total receipts for the St. Vincent de Paul Society were \$84,177.13 – **all of that came from St. Dominic Parish donations.** Because of your generous donations, we were able to help 459 households with 1,333 individuals.

Thankfully, we had some funds leftover from last year, because our total expenses for fiscal 2023 were \$85,844.36. The breakdown of the “direct aid” that SVdP provided is as follows:

Utility Bills (Duke Energy and GCWW)	\$ 25,381.66
Food and Kroger Gift Cards.....	\$ 12,893.12
Rent & Mortgage Assistance.....	\$ 34,373.03
“Twinning Help” to neighboring SVdP Conferences	\$ 11,855.00
Funeral	\$ 500.00
Miscellaneous (rent for a Storage Unit, car repairs, dues)	\$ 841.55

In addition to this “direct aid,” St. Dominic’s St. Vincent de Paul provided clothing/household and furniture and bed vouchers from the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Stores worth almost \$17,000.00.

This past year, our members spent over 1,307 hours and drove over 2,900 miles helping our neighbors in need. We bought food and gift cards and stocked the pantry so we could provide and deliver food to our neighbors. We are kept busy answering the phone, listening to, and advising our neighbors.
