

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Making a difference

My dad once told me a great story about my grandfather. One evening, my dad was sitting at the dinner table drinking iced of tea and my granddad notices that his hands were shaking. So, he asked my dad what was wrong with his hands. My dad answered that nothing was wrong, but the shaking persisted. So, granddad called him over to show him his hands. My father was reluctant to do so because that day he had been punished in school for talking to another student. Dad never said anything about it because he didn't want to get punished a second time at home for being punished the first time in school. My grandfather made my dad show him the palms of his hands which were severely blistered. Dad told him that earlier that day the "master" had hit him on the palms of the hands with a bamboo cane. In fact, he had hit him so severely and so many times that at 8:00 p.m. that same evening, dad's hands were still red and blistered.

The next day dad went to school as normal. His classroom had windows which looked out onto the street and during the early morning class period he could see my grandfather walking past and entering the school building. A few minutes later there was a knock on the classroom door. The boy who was designated went to the door and opened it and said to the "master": "Sir, Gerry's father would like to have a word with you." At that point the "master" left the room and closed the door behind him. Now, this man was a bully who terrorized the children under his care. Corporal punishment was the norm in those days, but this man carried it to an extreme and everyday some poor child was the victim of his malice and brutal punishment. My dad told me that the "master" was out there for a short time, the children in the classroom strained to hear what was being said but couldn't make out the conversation. After a short time, the "master" returned to the classroom, he looked pale and shaken. My grandfather never said another word to my dad about the incident, he never told him what had happened or what was said between the two men. Yet, that brute of a teacher never raised his hand to another child from that day. No child was brutalized, hit, or tormented, by that man again.

In the first reading today, we hear about Moses and prophets who stand in the midst of the community and speak for God. In the Gospel we hear that Jesus speaks with authority and even the demons listen to Him. In fact, Jesus' words make such a difference that those who are possessed are delivered from the demons who possess them.

The truth is that all of us are sent into the world by God to make a difference. We are sent to make the lives of others better, to speak for God, to protect the venerable, to watch over the lambs, to feed the hungry. We can state it whatever way we want but doing good by being good is essential and makes all the difference in the lives of those around us and our own lives also. Not all prophets need to speak but all prophets make a difference, and all prophets make God, and God's ways and will, present in the lives of others.

Sometimes, in the long view of things, we can wonder if we matter at all. I can tell you that one courageous working-class father caring for his son made all the difference in the world for little boys going to school in the inner-city docklands of Dublin. You matter more than you might think and to more people than you might think. And most of all, you matter to God – and ultimately, that's all that matters.


