

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation Adapted for Children

St. Dominic's RCIA process continues year-round. Because of this, adults and children can begin at any time. Most who come to the Catholic Church as adults do so because God has called them through other people. If YOU know someone who may be interested in the Catholic Faith, ask him or her to call us, or ask if he or she would like for you to call and make the first "contact."

While new Inquirers may join St. Dominic's RCIA process at any time, because of our lingering "school year mindset," many people begin to really consider inquiring about the faith as the new school year begins. Now is a great time to reach out and mention becoming Catholic to someone you know who may be considering it! RCIA – What is a Parish Sponsor?

St. Dominic Parish is blessed to have a vibrant RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) Program to welcome, teach and prepare those who are considering the Catholic faith. The RCIA team is made up of many roles. In addition to the Parish Sponsor, roles include:

- RCIA Coordinator
- Catechists or teachers
- Hospitality Ministers
- Sacristan for various RCIA rites

Being a Sponsor is like being a trusted friend to someone who is considering the Catholic faith.

- You share what you can about your own faith journey.
- You offer counsel and support to the extent that it is needed or desired.
- You offer your witness to your own faith.
- You serve as a bridge to the larger St. Dominic Parish community.
- You listen and you pray for the person.

Each relationship between a Sponsor and a Candidate or Catechumen is unique. As a Sponsor, you walk with a Candidate (baptized) or Catechumen (unbaptized) through a formation process that culminates with initiation into the Catholic Church.

A sponsor is not expected to know every aspect of the Church's teaching, but rather simply to be a guide, or companion, an example of a Catholic living your faith as best as you can. The sponsor is not an expert on the faith; he/she should be willing to say, "I do not know the answer, but I will find out." The Sponsor may also be asked questions about the Mass, such as postures and gestures; and about some of our other practices of prayer. A Sponsor who can admit his or her limitations and who continually tries to grow is an excellent faith model. Sponsors are supported by the parish's RCIA Team, members of whom can be called upon to help answer a Candidate's or Catechumen's questions.

A Sponsor participates in the RCIA process by accompanying the Candidate or Catechumen as often as possible at the catechetical (learning) sessions held each Sunday from 10:30-11:30 a.m., September through May. These sessions are facilitated by an RCIA Team member and involve an exploration of the Church's teachings within the context of scripture and prayer.

Sponsors also participate in other brief Rites that recognize important steps in the participant's faith formation. These Rites usually take place at Mass and occur infrequently throughout the RCIA process. Finally, a Sponsor may also assume an active role at the Mass when the Candidate or Catechumen receives the Sacraments of Initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist.

The RCIA Team provides Sponsor support and is available to answer any questions sponsors may have.

Parental Preparation for Their Infant's Baptism

Baptisms take place on the first two Sundays of each month at 1:00 p.m. Parents requesting Baptism of their first child are asked to attend a preparation session. During this time, we will look at the history and theology of the sacrament, reflect on our own Baptism, and look at ways to pass the Catholic faith on to our children. Godparents are encouraged to attend as well. Our next session is scheduled for Sunday, September 23 after the 11:30 a.m. Mass in church. Requirements for Those Volunteering with Children

As a reminder, all volunteers are required to attend one VIRTUS live training session. You can attend this training at any location at a date/time that works best for you. Find training locations, registration details and steps to create your VIRTUS user account at www.VIRTUS.org. Click on training, then live training to see a list of all scheduled live training sessions.

The second requirement for volunteers is to complete an online background check request. Payment for this is by credit card or "token" at the time of your online request. Contact the organization for which you volunteer to get information on obtaining a token for payment. To initiate the online background check, sign in to your VIRTUS.org user account, click the "Toolbox" tab then click the selection.com background check link. Children's Liturgy of the Word

The Children's Liturgy of the Word will begin again on Sunday, September 9. The Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is one of several ministries for the young children of the parish. During the Liturgy of the Word, the children and their catechists leave the body of the church, going to the Gathering Place for a child-friendly learning experience that mirrors the Scripture readings, Creed and Prayers of the Faithful. The children then return to their families in church to celebrate the remainder of Mass.

CLOW is for children in Kindergarten-2nd grade. No sign-up or enrollment is required! Simply join us at 9:30 a.m. Mass and listen for Father to call the children and their catechists to gather in the front of church and process to the Gathering Place.
