LENTEN LECTURE SERIES

This Lent, at St. Dominic, you will have an opportunity like never before, to renew your discipleship and make this Easter your most joyous and profoundly spiritual yet! Prepare your heart to truly receive Jesus' resurrection blessings by attending the Lenten Lecture Series that will be presented here starting Wednesday, March 8 (the Wednesday after Ash Wednesday). 

ST. DOMINIC'S NEW ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM

Learn More About Your Faith through Adult Education! St. Dominic Parish announces the creation of its new Adult Education Program starting on Sunday, January 8. This is an informal, discussion-oriented program that is designed to offer answers to questions you always wanted to ask. Classes will meet in the Faith Sharing Room in the Parish Center on Sunday mornings following the 9:30 a.m. Mass and will last approximately one hour. The program will run for ten weeks and you are free to attend as many of the classes as you wish. Classes will be led by Joe Zalot who earned his Ph.D. in systematic theology/ethics and is a St. Dominic parishioner. Refreshments will be provided. There is no charge and no pre-registration needed, all are welcome. Here's the schedule of the topics we will cover:

- Week 1: "Defining" the Catholic Church it's more than just a building. The Church as one, holy (the Church is holy?), catholic, and apostolic
- Week 2: Structure of the Catholic Church "What is the laity and what role does it play?" "What is a deacon, priest, bishop, archbishop, cardinal, and pope... and what do they do?
- Week 3: What happens when we die? "Will I go to heaven, hell, or purgatory?"
- Week 4: "What do I believe?" (part 1) The foundational beliefs of the Apostles Creed (we say this in church)
- Week 5: "What do I believe?" (part 2) Heresy and how it influenced the Nicene/Constantinople Creed (what does consubstantial mean?)
- Week 6: Sacraments "What is a sacrament and how are sacraments efficacious (what ?!?)?"
- Week 7: Sacrament of Baptism "It's more than just the water ... and a party"
- Week 8: Sacrament of the Eucharist "The bread and wine are really Jesus' body and blood?!?"
- Week 9: Sacrament of Marriage (part 1) "What's marriage for, and why is it a lifetime commitment?"
- Week 10: Sacrament of Marriage (part 2) "Why can't we just live together ... why is it one man and one woman?"
