
CHRIST RENEWS HIS PARISH


HOSPITALIZED PARISHIONERS

- 1. Upon admission, let them know you are Catholic.
- 2. Notify the Parish Office at 471-7741, ext. 0 if you are in the hospital. (Hospitals no longer make the call.)
- 3. If you are scheduled for surgery, call the Parish Office at 471-7741, ext. 0, for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick **BEFORE** you go to the hospital.
- Ask your nurse to call a hospital chaplain to offer spiritual care, help answer questions, provide Communion and help contact your parish.
