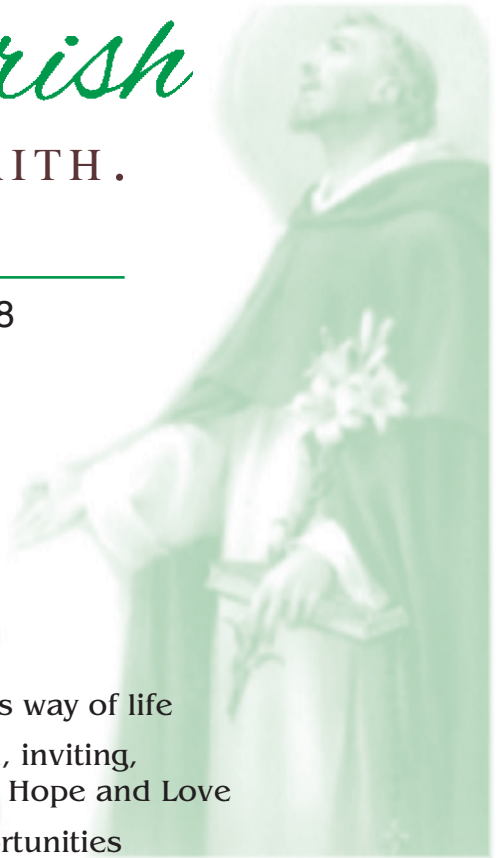

In order to be eligible, your daughter must be a St. Dominic student or currently enrolled and actively participating in St. Dominic PSR. High School players must have attended St. Dominic School or be a member of St. Dominic Parish. Attending a tryout is mandatory to be considered for the competitive teams; however, all are encouraged to attend for practice drills (open gym). Any players not attending a tryout will automatically be placed on a recreational level team.
