**ST. DOMINIC ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY**

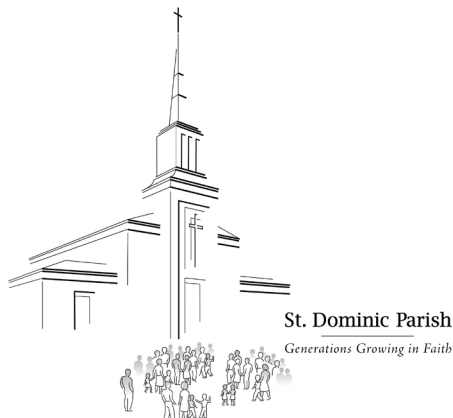
We wish to extend a very big "THANK YOU" to all the parishioners of St. Dominic. Through your generous donations we were able to provide help to many families.

From July through September of 2016, your St. Vincent De Paul Society was able to help 64 families and 211 adults and children in the Delhi area. Our total receipts for the third quarter of this year was \$4,215 from poor box collections, parishioner donations, the school children and member donations.
