Sacrament of Reconciliation

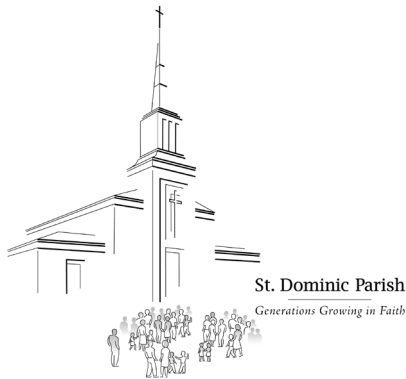
Every Saturday, 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., or by appointment.
