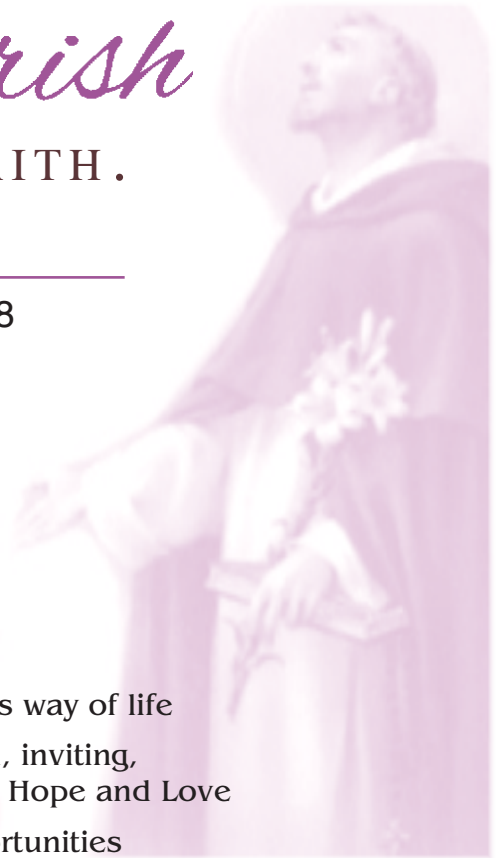

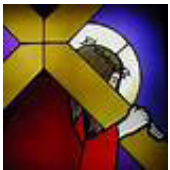

RCIA NEWS

Following the Rite of Sending on Sunday, March 5 at the 9:30 a.m. Mass, members of St. Dominic who are preparing for full reception into the church participated in the Archdiocesan Rite of Election at St. Peter in Chains Cathedral. In this rite those who are not yet Baptized (Catechumens) were presented to Bishop Binzer and following the testimony of their godparents and sponsors, they were declared to be members of The Elect, those to be initiated into the Sacred Mysteries via Baptism, Confirmation and receiving their First Eucharist at the upcoming Easter Vigil. For those already baptized as Christians or as Catholics, but not been fully initiated via First Eucharist and Confirmation, the Bishop celebrated the Call to Continuing Conversion. Based on the testimony of their sponsors, these Candidates for full communion with the church have been declared candidates to receive the remaining sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

The St. Dominic Parish St. Vincent de Paul Conference which serves ALL the people in our territory which includes most of Delhi, Sedamsville and Riverside would like to recruit some new members.

Since the need for help has increased over the last decade, so have the calls to the St. Dominic Parish St. Vincent de Paul hotline for food, furniture and clothing as well as utility and rent assistance.

Because of the increased need and calls, we need more members in our St. Vincent de Paul conference who are capable of and willing to make house calls. This is both a challenging and a rewarding opportunity for the volunteers. Volunteers need to be able to drive and should have at least limited computer skills.

Since most of the St. Vincent de Paul work is done during the day, this is a great opportunity for a retired person who wants to remain active. It is also a good opportunity for married couples because Vincentians always work in pairs.

Training is provided. Members answer phone calls received on the St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul hotline from their homes for a week at a time about once every six (6) weeks.

The St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul Conference has weekly meetings on Monday evenings from 7:00 – 8:00 p.m. to discuss the activities of the previous week.

Since the St. Joseph dinner is on Saturday and the rules of abstinence do not apply, as they did in Italy when the tradition began, we will be serving meatballs with the meal, even though the purest of St. Joseph Day celebrations continue to be meatless.

Due to the nature of the dinner, and the overwhelming response in the past, we need to know the approximate number attending, and we do find it necessary to limit the number.
