**MISSION APPEAL NEXT WEEK WITH FR. RUFFINO EZAMA**

The Comboni Missionaries of the Heart of Jesus were founded by Saint Daniel Comboni, the first Bishop of Central Africa, in 1867. Originally, they were a group of priests and brothers from all over Europe doing mission work in Africa under the name of "Institute for the African Mission." They became a religious society in 1895. Up to recent years, they were popularly known as "Verona Fathers." In 1979, the name was changed to the present form to honor both the founder and the spirituality of the society.

Presently, the Comboni Missionaries number close to 1,700. There are just as many Comboni Missionary Sisters. They serve in over thirty countries of Africa, Europe, the Americas and Asia.

Funds collected during the Missionary Cooperative Plan go mostly into a "small mission projects" fund that sponsors people and related projects in Africa and Latin America. Currently, many of the projects are directed to refugee resettlement in the Sudan (including Darfur), Uganda and Congo, AIDS prevention and AIDS orphans assistance, training of local missionaries both lay and religious, women's education at secondary level, establishing wells and other sources of safe water for desert dwellers in Ethiopia, Eritrea and Kenya.

Fr. Ruffino Ezama is a Ugandan Comboni missionary who was ordained a priest in 1994. In 1996, he served in the parish of Saint Francis of Assisi in Archdiocese of Cotonou (in the Republic of Benin, a country which is about 24% Christian and over 60% belonging to the traditional religion Vodou). He worked in the pastoral activities of this large parish. In 2001 and 2002, Fr. Ruffino worked in Lodongo Basilica Parish (a Parish of about 90% Muslims) in Arua Diocese of Uganda as assistant Pastor. He was the Provincial Vocation Promoter of the Comboni Missionaries in Uganda Province from 2004-2008. He is now a member of the North American Province doing education programs in our Provincial House of Cincinnati.

## IMPORTANT CHANGES TO KROGER GIFT CARD PROGRAM

Kroger has replaced their Reloadable Gift Card Program with the new Community Rewards Program effective May 1, 2012. Kroger will no longer require reloadable gift cards – our rewards will be linked directly to your REGISTERED Kroger Plus Card.
