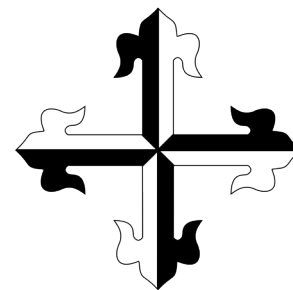

**SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

**CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?**

**INFANT BAPTISMS**

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

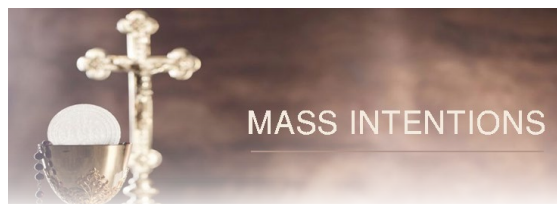

**FR. BEN'S COLUMN****Lent – A time of preparation and training**

Every summer, in the heat of the day and evening, I see kids on the football fields dressed in all their gear running plays. I often comment to coaches on the stamina and commitment the kids must have to undertake the strenuous training in such heat. It rarely seems to bother them. Similarly, I see children giving up their own time not only to compete in sport competitions but huge amounts of time to practice, running cross-country, baseball, softball, basketball, volleyball, soccer, constantly running drills and plays. They practice over and over and hone their skills, develop their physical stature, and form themselves into a team. The same is true for other interests such as the musical and intellectual pursuits like special projects, music, chess, you get my point. Not only do parents support their children in these strenuous efforts, but they also actively encourage them. Why? Because training, honing skills, developing expertise, brings success and they want to be winners. What's most amazing about this is the commitment of the children and, even more surprisingly, very few seem to think this level of commitment to training is odd, over the top, too much, or ridiculous. We see the same sort of effort, sacrifice, commitment, and focus put into things like forming the body through fast, diet and exercise. Because it is a goal in life, we are willing to work, and even suffer and sacrifice, for our success.

The Holy Scriptures, both in the Hebrew and Christian Testaments, as well as many of the spiritual experts in our Church, speak of spiritual growth in similar ways. We are beings made up of body, soul and spirit and it makes sense that all these elements should have a part to play in our relationship with God. They can be formed to work with God's grace so that we can be who God wants us to be and live as God wants us to live. Penitential and spiritual practices for religious purposes make as much sense as do similar practices for human endeavors, but while human endeavors come and go, spiritual success is eternal.

**Why Ashes?**

On Ash Wednesday the faithful receive ashes. This is the ancient tradition of the Church and is the sign that we are entering a season of spiritual purification. It is a sign of conversion, sorrow for sin, and acceptance of God's will. The sign itself is a Biblical sign. We see examples of it in the Book of Jonah, Job, and even in the Gospels. In the funeral liturgy it is a sign of our mortality. The use of ashes as a sign was taken up by the ancient Church and was a sign of the human condition impacted by sin and penance. In this sign we outwardly profess our guilt before God and, prompted by the hope that the Lord is kind and compassionate, patient and abounding in mercy, we express our desire for inner conversion and the reception of God's life-giving grace. God's grace is the ointment that brings back to life the soul turned to dry, dead, and life destroying ashes. The sign of ashes is also the beginning of a journey of conversion that reaches its goal in the celebration of the sacrament of reconciliation during the days leading to the great feast of life at Easter. At Easter, with Christ, we rise from the dead through God's gift of grace and life.

**FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED****Ash Wednesday and Good Friday:  
Days of Fast and Abstinence**

Only two days in the year remain days of fast and abstinence and they are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fast and abstinence means that able-bodied adults, in good health, between the age of eighteen and sixty are asked to have only one full meal (and two smaller meals) and refrain from eating meat on these two days. Fridays in Lent remain days of abstinence, meaning that those in good health, between the ages of eighteen and sixty, are asked to refrain from eating meat. There is no obligation to fast on the weekdays of Lent, but voluntary acts of penance and self-denial are recommended.

Some areas of fasting could include candy, electronic/computer games, social media, alcohol, either total or partial (i.e. not to use social media at all for Lent, or on certain days of the week, or until after 6:00 p.m. in the evening).

We might consider doing extra things: Attending daily Mass, or an extra two Masses a week during Lent, or serve at the local soup kitchen, or say the Rosary every day, give an extra donation each week to a charity, or visit a relative in the nursing home.

**LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday, February 14 and Good Friday, March 29, are days of abstinence from meat and days of fasting (that is, limited to a single full meal). Regarding Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled: Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with an uplifted and clear mind. (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110.)

The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).

Regarding the obligatory days listed above, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more, rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

1st Reading: Genesis 9:8-15
