The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

ST. DOMINIC VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL


Looking ahead to the end of summer for your kids and hoping you are thinking of something fun, and faith filled for them to do? Our Vacation Bible School program will be perfect!

REQUIREMENTS FOR THOSE VOLUNTEERING WITH CHILDREN Quarterly Training Bulletin Due by April 24, 2022

SafeParish is the child protection platform for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. All new volunteers should follow the SafeParish registration instructions for creating a SafeParish account. You can find a copy of the SafeParish registration instructions and a link to SafeParish on our website at www. stdominicdelhi.org. Click on the "SafeParish" button on the left side of the page.

During the registration process, new volunteers will be invited to complete their background check and child protection training online. The \$25.00 fee for this can be paid by credit card or with a "token." Contact the parish ministry for which you volunteer to get information on obtaining a token for payment. For any questions concerning SafeParish, please go to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Safe Environment webpage at https://catholicaoc.org/offices/safe-environment.

Weekly Emails – Each Tuesday, SafeParish sends an email regarding the updated child protection and workplace safety articles that are posted on the SafeParish website. These articles are NOT required, but are recommended reading.

Quarterly Bulletins – Everyone registered with SafeParish should have received the quarterly video. The training bulletin must be completed by April 24, 2022, in order to remain active and in compliance with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Child Protection Policy.

No one may work with children if they are not active and in compliance. If you did not get the bulletin, check your spam or junk mail. You can also sign into your account, go to the Training Tab and click on the "Due" link to see which bulletins are due and their due date.
