SAFE PARISH**Important Information for All Volunteers**

Quarterly Bulletins – Everyone registered with SafeParish receives a quarterly training video. The training bulletin must be completed within 30 days to remain active and in compliance with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Child Protection Policy.

If you have a bulletin past due, you are not permitted to work/volunteer with children, according to the Archdiocesan policy. If you have not completed the most recent bulletin which was assigned in December, and due in January, please do so as soon as possible.

Even if you only volunteer during a single sports season, or at certain times during the school year, it is important to keep the account in an active status.

Go to the Training Tab and click on the "Due" link to see which bulletins are due and their due date. Each Lent, Catholic families across the country unite to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Through CRS Rice Bowl, families learn about how our sisters and brothers across the globe overcome hardships like hunger and malnutrition, and how through Lenten alms, we have the power to make the world a better place for all. You can pick up your Rice Bowls at the doors of Church on Ash Wednesday and the First Sunday of Lent.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**Don't let failure define who you are.**

The last words of people are considered important and so we tend to listen for them and record them. Of course, some people want their last words to be memorable and so they prepare them, or write them, in order to make a statement or to be remembered as witty, or smart, or avant guard, or show their bravado. Some famous last words include Winston Churchill's "I'm bored with it all," or, Jack Daniels, "One last drink please." There are the famous words of Joe DiMaggio, "I finally get to be with Marilyn." As he lay dying Steve Jobs was heard to whisper, "Oh Wow. Oh Wow. Oh Wow." Mozart said: "The taste of death is on my lips. I feel something that is not of this world." While Edgar Allen Poe prayed: "Lord help, my poor soul." Leonard Da Vinci raised a regret: "I have offended God and mankind because my work did not reach the quality it should have."

During the Irish Civil War, the Irish patriot Erskin Childers, as he stood before a firing squad of his own countrymen at Beggars Bush Barracks said to the soldiers: "Take a step forward, lads, it will be easier that way."

As he lay dying, Pope John Paul II could hear the singing of the youth as they gathered in St. Peter's Square, and he was heard to say: "I searched for you, and you have come to me." A little while later, his last words were: "Let me go to the house of my Father." And more recently, the last words of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI were: "Lord, I love you."

A dying declaration is considered so important that in many legal and judicial jurisdictions in many countries for many centuries, it was admissible as evidence worthy of testimony.

This brings us to the last words of Jesus. Here there are two different occasions. The first as Jesus was dying on the Cross where He said "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34). And the second, before His Ascension, Jesus gave the power to forgive sins to His apostles and their successors: "Those whose sins you forgive they are forgiven them." (John 20:21-23). On agony on the Cross and during His first encounter with the Apostles after His Resurrection, Jesus speaks of forgiveness. The words of a dying man and the first words of the Resurrected Lord. Surely, we can recognize the supreme significance of what Jesus offers us. The very mission of the Lord was salvation, to restore God's children to God; to take us out of darkness into God's light, to remove the eternal condemnation of death and give us God's own life, to lift us up from the dirt and to restore us as the children of God. Slaves to sin no more Jesus raises us up from the ground and gives us back the opportunity to live as God created us to live, to experience the grace, love, and life God wants us to experience.

God knows that we are frail, that we tend to fall, that we can be weak. However, God does not want failure, darkness, death, or sin to define us. We are created for better things and a better life. Jesus, therefore, gives us the means by which we can start again, by which we can be renewed, the help we need to rise up and carry on. "Those whose sins you forgive are forgiven them." These are the words of Jesus, last words, powerful testimony, and they are made real in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we enter into Lent, maybe we should take the Lord at His word and receive the forgiveness and grace that enables us to start again, rise up, live in the light, receive the grace. No sin is greater than God's love, no number of sins, is greater than God's love, and Christ's sacrifice is sufficient to heal all wounds and clean all souls. It would be a shame to allow failure, a fall, or sin, darkness, or death, to define who we are and the life we lead – when the remedy to failure is at hand and freely given.

LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE
Ash Wednesday, February 22 and Good Friday, April 7,
are days of abstinence from meat and days of fast (that
is, limited to a single full meal). Regarding Good Friday, the
 teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled:

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with an uplifted and clear mind. Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110.

The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).

Regarding the obligatory days listed above, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more, rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.
