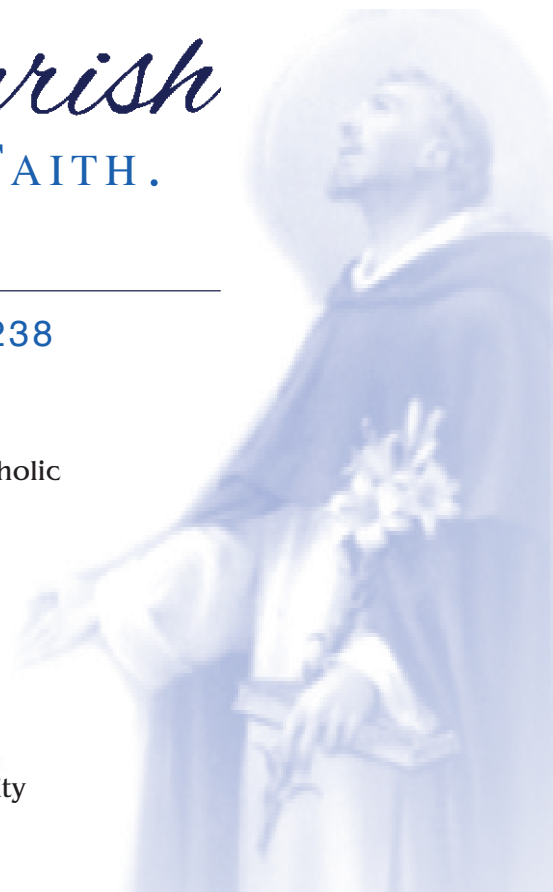

PROTECT THEM BOTH

Help Protect the Dignity of Life in Ohio

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that “human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception.” The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs like Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. Starting this week, the following ***Protect Them Both*** materials about the proposed amendment are available in Ohio parishes:

- **Protect Them Both Prayer Card:** Unite with Catholics across Ohio in asking God to strengthen us as we defend and accompany mothers and preborn children.
- **Dignity of Life Threatened in Ohio Flyer:** Learn more about the proposed amendment and what you can do now.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

Considering Entering the Catholic Church?

Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 471-7741, ext. 0.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Every Saturday, 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., or by appointment.

Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**Love One Another As I Have Loved You**

According to Saint Paul, God sent His Son, Jesus, to die for us while we were still sinners (Romans 5:8). A sin is a serious offense against God. Yet it was while we were sinners that God sent His Son. Sometimes it's hard enough to love a friend, a family member, even a son or daughter, husband or wife, even when they have done nothing to offend us, but it is especially hard to love when they have hurt us, failed us, abandoned, or betrayed us. We could say that they "sinned" against us. It can be hard, and it can take a long time, to overcome some of the deep hurts that we inflict on each other.

Yet, while we were still sinners, God sent His only Son, His beloved Son, to show us how much, how deeply, how completely, our Father loves us. He loved us so much that He sent His Son to die for us. In all He said and did, Jesus shows us the depth of the Father's love. In His preaching and teaching, in feeding the hungry, healing the sick, raising the dead, showing compassion to the sinner, and searching for the lost, in suffering and in dying – for us sinners – Jesus shows the extent of the Father's love for His children. God's love forgives.

Love can be romantic and passionate, joyous, and tender, but it is also strong, committed, it is a willingness to suffer for the sake of another. Love is willing to make sacrifices because it seeks what is good, and compassionate, and holy, and to spend our energy and our life doing what is necessary for the one we love. But it seems to me that as well as doing good for others, the hardest and strongest part of love is that – love forgives. To love one another as Jesus loves us: I wonder what does that love look like in our lives?

The sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross enabled us to receive God's grace because God was willing to forgive. What healing grace can be released in our lives, and in the lives of our family and friends, if we dare to love each other as Jesus and the Father love us.

Because it all seems to happen around us, it can look so effortless; but the truth is, many people work very hard to make our worship of God wonderful faith-filled liturgies and parish celebrations. St. Dominic's SVdP Society has a new president, Christelle Middendorf, who succeeded Gary Ott whose term is completed. Christelle is already providing great leadership and encouragement. Our receipts from January 1-March 31, 2023 were \$34,483.89. Our total expenses for the same period were also significant at \$29,210.62. In the first quarter of 2023, we provided aid 101 times to 273 individuals. The breakdown of the "direct aid" that we gave is as follows:
