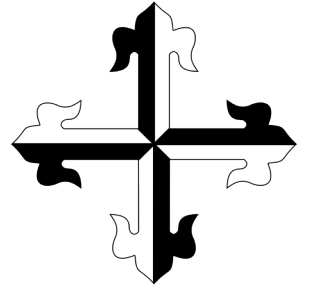

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**The vine that chokes, or the vine that bears fruit! Which one am I?**

Did you know that in the nineteenth century, the Ohio Valley was one of the biggest wine producing regions in the United States with an enormous number of vineyards all through this area? Ohio wines followed a mostly German style which is described, for both white and red wine as “light, fresh and slightly sweet.” The vines planted here, like the Germans that planted them, were of a hardier variety, able to withstand colder and wetter climates. A number of factors killed off wine production in this area: Vines need a lot of attention, and the Civil War (1861-1865) drew young farmers off the land and the vines weren't tended and some grew out of control and lost quality. As a consequence, fungal disease, such as downy mildew and black rot – always a threat in damp climates – caused extensive damage to the vines. The vines had little time to recover before the next killer of the wine industry in Southern Ohio; Prohibition which “dried out” the state. When Prohibition ended in 1933, very little was left of a once thriving industry.

Here are some interesting things about planting and tending vines. After digging and preparing the soil, you put in posts along which you attach wires to tie up the branches that grow from the vines. Each new plant is about fifteen inches long. It takes three years before the vine produces a grape that is large enough and sweet enough to make good wine. Even then, the vine will only produce suitable grapes if the vine is properly cared for. Growing vines and producing grapes requires patience. In the first year of planting, the branches of the vines can grow seven feet long, but the grapes are small and not suitable for wine. For the first three years, the branches of the vines are cut back to the size they were when they were planted, fifteen inches. After three years, it is cut back sixty percent each year. Now that's a pretty radical cutting.

Here is the important thing. If the vine is left to itself, it will put all its energy into producing branches and foliage and not roots or fruit. It becomes something of a showoff. It looks great but it has no roots, fruit, or substance. The vine spends so much time and energy on how it looks, that the roots don't grow and develop, they remain shallow and small, failing to draw out the necessary sustenance from the soil. Over a short time, the vine will therefore die of hunger because it has no nutrients. The grapes produced are few and very small and they taste bitter. Unless they are tended every year, the vine produces no fruit. While it looks like it has great branches, leaves, and looks good, without care and pruning it will soon wither and die.

The care of the vine is just as Jesus describes in the Gospel. Jesus tells us that a life cut off from God is like a vine that grows wild. Growing wild, it puts all its energy into itself, looks good, spreading itself all over the place, wrapping around and choking everything around it. But it is not growing, it is not sinking its roots into the soil where the nutrients are. On the surface it spreads itself all around and underground it is shallow. While it looks good, it is actually decaying from within and has no future, no hope, and bears no worthwhile fruit.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED

To have a healthy vine that produces worthwhile fruit, the vine must be cared for, nurtured, and pruned, constantly, even radically, but always lovingly. To grow spiritually and as a decent human being, we must cut out what grows but does not produce good fruit. Bitterness, envy, spite, hatred, gossip, fear, attitudes, and habits that can grow wild, fast, and wrap themselves around every relationship and aspect of our lives. If they are not cut out, they grow wild and choke everything they touch. Without the pruning, our spirit loses its focus and sense of purpose, and the soul dies within us, so we become an empty shell, a decaying creature.

Jesus is the vine, and we are the branches, and God, is the vinedresser. To grow, we must allow the constant and even the radical pruning, of our souls and spirits, our nature and heart. Pruning allows the roots to grow and to truly live; we need to sink our roots into the deep soil of the life of God's grace, especially through the sacraments and prayer, good works, healthy friendships, and virtuous living, to produce good fruit. This is the type of life that is worth having and the life, which is worth living, the type of person worth being and a friend worth knowing.

A PERFECT GIFT

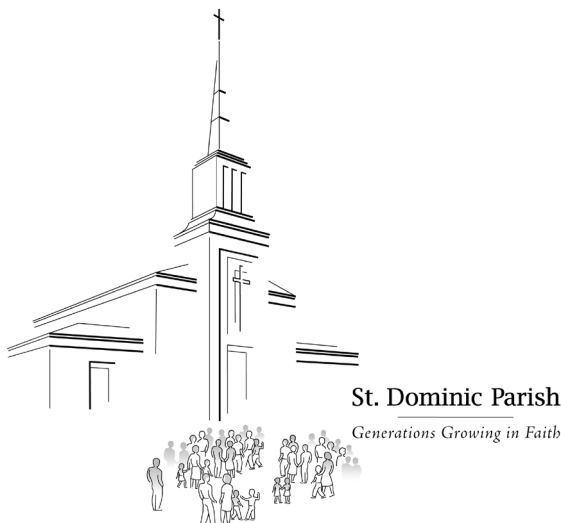
