For those of you who don't know me, my name is Ashly and Joe is my Grandpa. He truly was an amazing man and for those of you who knew him, knew that he was nothing short of this. He loved his beautiful wife of 55 years and his three boys dearly. He spoke often of his sister and brothers and his grandchildren and great grandchildren that were sure to keep him on his toes. He loved to talk about his past and his passion for cars and all I know is that by the end of the conversation you will know what the make, model and engine was of every car he drove.

He had jokes for days and that smile was contagious. Skyline was always on the menu and he predicted the weather like it was his job. He was simple. Give him a button-down or a white tee with his air-conditioned shoes and he was good to go. If you talked about family vacation, you better believe he was ready to pack up and head out, but do not forget the mascot! When we would return and get settled in, he just could not resist to say, "Did we leave yet?" as our time always seemed to fly by. Our week felt like days and our days like minutes. We enjoyed every second.

I could go on for days about what he means to our family, but he was so much more than I could ever describe. I think the one thing our family can agree on that sticks out the most is that he was a "fighter." He put up the fight of a lifetime and never backed down. Not once did he give in.

He believed in his God and his Church. He believed that all things happen for a reason and he was never one to question (unless he was questioning Grandma to see her reaction). He had all the faith in the world that his life was in God's hands and for that very reason he knew he was safe. He knew one day God would call him home and his pain would disappear, and although he would be leaving his loved ones here on earth, he was sure to be greeted by the loved ones he has lost.

If Grandpa was here today and could say one last thing, I believe that he would look Grandma in the eyes and say, "Thank you, I love you, and please do not be sad." Grandpa knew that you loved him unconditionally and because we believe in the Lord above, this is not the end. Hold on to those memories that you cherished together, hold on to your faith, you also are a fighter and have an army beside you.

As we leave here today, he would want us to celebrate his life. Remember his kind and humble spirit, remember his smile that went ear to ear. Remember to fight through your struggles and to never give in. Remember that jeans with holes better be ½ off and polka dots don't go under white pants. Think back to all the good times and know that he is home now. He will be waiting for us with arms wide open as God calls upon the rest of us.
