What a remarkable Triduum and Easter celebration! The reverence and responsiveness of the congregation and the music at the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper always inspires me. A highlight for me every year is watching the parish venerate the cross on Good Friday...parents coming up with little children and placing their little hands on the feet of Jesus...seeing the love and the devotion and the sorrow in people's eyes. It is a moving experience!


## PARISH PICTORIAL DIRECTORY
