

What a remarkable service the bereavement ministry offers the parish throughout the year and especially each November with our Memorial Mass. On behalf of all who have lost loves ones in St.



Dominic Parish, I offer to them a sincere "thank you!" Each year they plan our Memorial Mass for those families who have lost loved ones during the year.

Again, this year it was a very moving and comforting liturgy. Each name is read, as a candle, lit from the paschal candle, is held up. As the program for the Mass says: "The names of our loved ones are precious to us, and we treasure the gifts and memories that the sound of their name calls forth. A candle bearing each of their names has been lit from the flame of the Easter Candle to remind us that, although we are without their physical presence, the light of Christ still shines within them and holds us close in His love."

Last Monday night, eighty-eight names were read. We had a congregation of two hundred. Beautiful singing by Gene Johnson, as usual! Jim Dickman accompanied with Eileen Wagner on flute. Eileen lost her mother Mary Ann this year, so we were blessed with her world-class talent.

Eighty-eight candles, each representing a special person and life transition from this world to the next! We miss their physical presence with us. But they are with us in spirit, especially when we gather at the table of the Lord for Eucharist! Feel their presence! They are in communion with the Lord and so are we!

ST. DOMINIC SCHOOL THANKS YOU

My name is Bill Cavanaugh, and I am the principal here at St. Dominic. Last year, you may recall, Fr. Jim contacted Field Development Consultants to conduct a Parish Stewardship Review. Parishioners were interviewed during individual and focus group discussions, and there were areas that were identified that needed to be improved.

One of those areas in which there was a strong consensus is that the school should be air conditioned. Temperatures in those classrooms could get up to 95 degrees! I wanted to let you know the Parish Administration Team took your input seriously and responded accordingly. In September, all the Kindergarten to 8th grade classrooms were air conditioned with window units. On October 12, the Preschool rooms were air conditioned as well.

On behalf of the staff and students at our school, I would like to thank you for your input last year to the Parish Stewardship Review and your financial support that funded this project. Having air conditioning in our school has provided an improved learning environment for our students and a better working environment for the staff.

I just wanted to let you know how much we appreciate this unexpected gift of air conditioning! What was once a dream has become a reality! Thank you very much.


