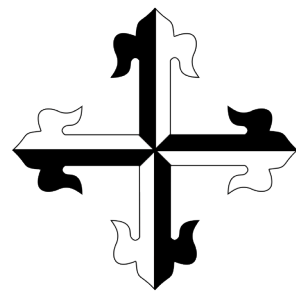

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**Let God do what He needs to do.**

One evening, many years ago, I was on my way to see a friend and as I passed the church, our parish priest waved over to me. Fr. Gerard was a really good priest and a very kind man. He knew everyone in the parish by name, men, women, children, dogs, cats, buddies. He told me that the monastery was holding a weekend for men considering the priesthood and he invited me to go. I told him I wasn't interested as at that time I had a job and was dating a girl I really liked. He suggested I might just go to get away and take the time to rest and pray. I took him up on the offer and a few weeks later, I found myself standing on the front porch of the monastery speaking with the vocation's director. It seems that Fr. Gerard invited me to go for the weekend, but neglected to tell anyone there that I was coming. Nevertheless, I chatted with the vocation's director as we waited for others to arrive. He had invited about twenty men, I was not one of them, but I was the only one to turn up and I wasn't interested in joining up! A year later, I gave up my job, my girlfriend, and I was in the monastery preparing for the priesthood.

I can't explain exactly how this happened, but I know it was the grace of God that moved things along. The Kingdom of God, Jesus tells us, is like that. Seeds are planted, we don't see them grow, yet, night and day, imperceptibly, they put down roots, they mature, they sprout, they flower, they produce fruit, and they scatter other seeds. Sometimes we must let God do what God needs to do, after all, it is God who makes things grow.

Every gardener and farmer can tell you that we must be patient and let life take its course. Expectant parents can tell you the same thing. The baby will come when he/she is good and ready. It's not that we don't have anything to do as we wait, the ground must be tilled, seeds must be planted, watered, nurtured, tended, and eventually harvested. As we wait for the child to be born, mothers go on special diets, clothing must be gathered, rooms prepared, houses made "baby-proof," and safe. It takes work and effort but the gift of life, the imperceptible growth (in the soil and in the womb), that is the work of God. It will be the same in the home, in the parish, in the lives of our children, our families, our friends and our own lives. Given the opportunity, God can bring forth life even when we can't see it, even when we don't know it is there. Seeds, growth, life, requires patience, even as we do what we can and what we should, to support what God needs to do.

The prophet Ezekiel gives us the image of the tree that grows up and makes a place for all the birds and creatures to find a home, a resting place. The image is one of thriving and energetic life. What a great image for a parish, a family, a home, a relationship, and a life. Let's build that!

CENSUS UPDATE

Thank you to all those who have already completed the parish census. If you would still like to complete the census, you will need to call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0. Registration and updating your parish information is important, and necessary for receiving sacraments (weddings, Baptisms, funerals, etc.), as well as priority for school registration. Likewise, if you need a letter of suitability attesting to your membership to be a godparent/sponsor, we can only provide this letter if you are a registered member. Those who do not complete the census may be inactivated and no longer registered parishioners.
