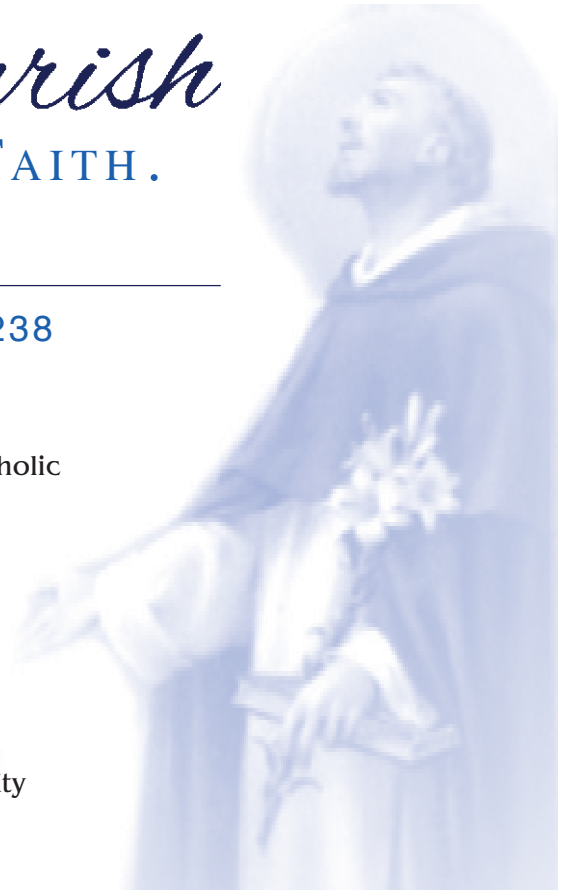

#### Training Due October 27, 2022

## FR. BEN'S COLUMN

### Our Mission is to Make Saints

After all his marvelous and unsurpassed writing about God, St. Thomas Aquinas had a vision of Jesus. The Lord said to Aquinas, "Thomas, you have written well of me. What reward can I give you." To which St. Thomas replied: "Nothing but you, O Lord." It is the desire of all created hearts to love the Lord and to be with Him. Settling for anything else is to be robbed, and to teach and encourage anyone else to settle for less is to steal from them the treasure they were created to have for all eternity – God's life, God's Love. We are not in the business of settling for anything less than what God wants, so our mission, as priests, parents, Catholics, a parish, is to make saints. We settle for "Nothing but you, O Lord."

My dear friends, when the Beacons of Light process began, when our Family of Parishes was constituted on the 1st July 2022, I told you that I would keep you informed as the process moved forward. I also told you that the process would be transparent, and would, over time, endeavor to engage all who wanted to be involved. This message is part of that process.

Let me define three things so we are all on the same page:

*Beacons of Light is:* A Process of pastoral planning to best arrange all the resources of the Archdiocese to proclaim the Gospel and make disciples in this particular time and place.

*A Family of Parishes is:* A grouping of parishes led by a common pastor and characterized by collaboration and shared resources.

*Our Vision Team is* (Family Leadership Team): The Vision Team consists of men and women from each of the five parishes in our family, assisted by staff members and parish committee members, who will assist the pastor and parish in formulating a vision and plan to best achieve the mission of building God's Kingdom in our family of parishes. They will also help formulate goals and strategies to facilitate this mission which will include forming a single parish, a single parish council, finance committee, and initiating practical policies for the development of the six guiding principles for parish life recommended by the archdiocese including: Eucharist, Church, Leadership, Stewardship, Evangelization, and Love in Action. The team will also help form a timeline for implementing these initiatives. Other areas of parish life that will be areas of consultation for the team will include, but not limited to, Mass schedules in light of fewer priests, parish administration, ministerial priorities, the evaluation, retention and use of buildings and sites, youth ministry and faith formation, school identity, recruitment, marketing and promotion, individual parish viability and finances. The men and women on the team are your fathers and mothers, brothers and sisters, friends, and neighbors. They will want what is best for all of us and they will work toward the good that Jesus intends.

This week, we take a major step forward with the inaugural meeting of our "Vision Team." The Vision Team will begin a process of deliberation, conversation, consultation, discussion, and, of course, prayer, as they help our Family of Parishes renew our commitment to building the Kingdom of God. That's right, building the Kingdom of God, or

evangelizing, a word that means make the Gospel come alive in human hearts. Evangelization is the purpose and focus of the Beacons of Light process and the mission of the Families of Parishes.

It is important for us to keep this goal in mind as we move into our future. The mission of the Church, the Archdiocese, the parish, and our mission has not changed. We have the same mission, one given to us by Jesus Himself, to "Go into the world and make disciples of all people." Another way to say this is, we are to build the Kingdom of God, in every heart, marriage, home, parish, city, county, every place and every person.

The Beacons of Light process, and the reconfiguration and consolidation of our five parishes, St. Dominic, St. Al's, St. Vincent, St. Simon, and Our Lady of Victory, is an opportunity to renew our approach to the mission, to refocus, and to reenergize, so that we can become more deliberate in being disciples and in doing God's work in our lives, in our time, and in this place.

The territory represented by our five parishes is our mission territory. The purpose of the mission is not to do all we can to keep buildings open, rather, it is to fill them with believers, with disciples. The focus is the mission, not the places. Places are to be at the service of the mission not the primary object of the mission. The territory of our mission is the territory of our parishes.

The parishes of our Family have a long and storied history and we intend to have an even longer future. If we need to change to bring about the Kingdom, well that's what we must do. We will be inventive, creative, brave, and courageous, after all, that's the kind of stock we come from. The Kingdom is first about hearts not places, and we will strive to reach every heart. The past is our heritage, and while we will do all we can to cherish and preserve it, we are not its slaves, we cannot be committed to unnecessarily keeping the past alive when we must be focused on making the future vibrant with faith and holiness. This is where our resources and energies will be channeled.

Isn't it funny that when you look up into the sky at night what you are looking at is mostly darkness, but your vision is not drawn to the darkness, it is drawn to the star, it is drawn to the light. I have no doubt that there will be darkness as we move forward but we are going to focus on the light, on the star, because we are servants of the light.

Please keep all these kind and generous people, serving on the Vision Team, in your prayers. May the will of Almighty God manifest itself in our consultations so that we may all serve Him with generous hearts.

May Mary, our beautiful Star, guide us to the Kingdom Her Son wants us to build.

As the process moves forward, I will keep you informed and updated with future bulletin messages.
