#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Lent ends at sunset on Holy Thursday. The Triduum (Latin word for "three days") begins. Though we call this time the Three Days, in spirit it is really one event. What we start on Holy Thursday we finish on Easter Sunday. These three days are the heart of our liturgical year, when we reflect on and celebrate the events that bring us salvation and eternal life. I would like to suggest that you try to plan now for how you will spend these three days. I suggest to you that these are three days when everything is important: what you do, where you go, what you eat and with whom you spend your time. My hope is that you will choose to spend some of the time with the community of disciples of Jesus that is St. Dominic Parish. We will be gathering on Holy Thursday night, Good Friday afternoon and evening, Saturday night for the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday.

May I suggest a few questions for your reflection and prayer during these days?

#### Thursday

Whose feet are you being called to wash? What is Jesus saying to you personally today? What do you want to say to Him?

#### Friday

What is Jesus' word to you personally from the cross today? What is your word to Him? What is your cross at this time in your life? How is God blessing you through it?

#### Saturday/Sunday

To what new life is God inviting you today? Does anything need to die first?

May this holiest week of the year be a time of grace for our parish and for each one of you.

#### **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

#### **Considering Entering the Catholic Church?**

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call Deacon Mark Bardonaro at 471–7741.

#### **Infant Baptisms**

Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 471-7741, ext. 0.

#### **Sacrament of Reconciliation**

Every Saturday, 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., or by appointment.

#### **Sacrament of Matrimony**

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

#### **Communion for the Sick and Homebound**

#### LENTEN REMINDERS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Good Friday, April 19, is a day of abstinence from meat and a day of fast (that is, limited to a single full meal). The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252). The teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled:

"Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with an uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)

Regarding the obligatory day listed above, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. To paraphrase Pope John Paul II: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more, rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.
