FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today, Palm Sunday, begins the most sacred week of our liturgical year. The Triduum is at the very heart of our Holy Week observances and devotions. The word is from the Latin, and it means



"three days." On Holy Thursday, we celebrate Jesus' gift of the Eucharist to us. On Good Friday, we celebrate Jesus' gift of His life for our salvation. At the Easter Vigil, and on Easter Sunday, we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and our destiny of sharing in God's life for all eternity.

Please note the schedule for our Holy Week services. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening begins at 7:00 p.m. Our Good Friday Celebrations of the Lord's Passion is at Noon and 7:00 p.m. (Please note that there will be no touching or kissing the crucifix at the Veneration of the Cross. A simple bow or genuflection will be the appropriate expression this year.) The Easter Vigil is on Saturday evening beginning at 8:00 p.m. Our celebration will be simpler this year as there will be no Baptisms.

On Easter Sunday our Masses are at 7:30, 9:30, and 11:30 a.m. We will be observing social distancing, so we will not be packing people in. When the church is appropriately filled, we will direct people to O'Connor Hall for live streaming. If that is filled, we will ask people to go home and livestream. With the pandemic, please prayerfully consider livestreaming the Holy Week services.

My hope and prayer for you this coming Holy Week is that you will respond with gratitude to the God who gives you the time of your life. And may that gratitude find expression in your giving back to God some of your prime time on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

May the Holy Week liturgies fill your hearts with love and gratitude for the salvation that is ours because of Jesus Christ, and His Passion, death, and Resurrection! End your Lent well, and may you all have a Happy Easter!

Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

Teach our hearts Your Good News




