FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent this week. During the forty days of Lent, the whole church is on retreat. We begin the season with a simple rite of making the sign of the cross with ashes on our foreheads. While it is a simple rite, it carries some profound implications and symbolism.

Ashes remind me that my body is of the earth. With time it ages and weakens and returns to the earth. That is part of the human condition. Ashes also remind me that human life is greater than the human body. Human life depends on the breath of God. Every moment of human life is a gift and a grace from God. Each moment of life is the gift of a generous God who wants to share life with me. My body will return to the earth only to be resurrected and glorified on the last day! The ashes remind me of the good news that God has promised to share life with me forever. God's life!

The ashes in the form of a cross remind me of the One I follow and where that following leads. Following Jesus means giving one's life for others. It also reminds me that while Jesus died on a cross, He didn't seek it. In fact, He prayed to be delivered from it. The cross came to Him because of His "Yes" to the Father and to us.

Lent is not primarily a time for us to go looking for good things to "give up!" Lent is a time for us to look at our relationships and our commitments. It is a time for us to say "Yes" again to Jesus Christ, to family and other significant people in our lives. If we do, we won't have to go looking for crosses; the cross will find us as it found Jesus. Lent isn't primarily about our spiritual projects. It is not about whether I can give up something for forty days. It is about renewing our relationships with God and one another. Lent will make a Pharisee out of me if it is all about me and has nothing to do with others.

May this season of Lent be for each of you a Spring-like renewal in your relationship with God, your family, your parish, and those with whom you work.

Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

ST. DOMINIC-DELHI KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, March 6 and Good Friday, April 19, are days of abstinence from meat and days of fast (that is, limited to a single full meal). Regarding Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled:

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with an uplifted and clear mind. Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110

The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).

Regarding the obligatory days listed above, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more, rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.
