It has been the blessing of my priesthood to walk this journey of faith with you during these last seventeen years. I was never so humbled to be a member of this community, much less its leader, than last week, as I witnessed this parish reach out in support and compassion for the Rolfes family. The tragic death of Jack Rolfes shook our community to its core. But what a response! Neighbors on Ihle Drive reaching out to comfort the family on Friday night along with two Delhi cops who are members of our faith family. Our PTO arranging the reception after the funeral, our maintenance staff going above and beyond the call of duty to set up the gym for the reception, our bereavement ministers helping the family prepare and carry out a comforting and joyful liturgy! The liturgy was enhanced by the Elder Glee Club's singing. the gathering of Jack's 2013 graduation class from St. Dominic, and the Elder class of 2017, all in coat and tie. We sent Jack off with the Elder Alma Mater. My heart is touched just by the memory of that celebration. The most impressive memory for me is the family coming up to the podium at the beginning to offer their personal tributes to their son and their brother. Their words were right on and betrayed a faith and a trust in God that I am sure touched the hearts of each of the thousand souls who filled our church that morning. What an inspiration it was! Yesterday, a parishioner came in with a check for \$2,000 "for any extra expenses for the Rolfes funeral!"

My prayer is that the Rolfes family will continue to experience the love and blessings of God in the expressions of support from the hundreds who came to the funeral home the night before and the church on the day of the funeral. May those expressions of support continue through the weeks and months ahead.


