ANOTHER WAY TO SUPPORT ST. DOMINIC

The IRS raised the age for Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) to age 72. However, you may still make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA account as long as you are at least age 72. If you are required to make an RMD, QCDs will satisfy your annual distribution requirement and will not be included in your taxable income for the year. This could be a great way to save taxes and financially support St. Dominic Parish. Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

Considering Entering the Catholic Church?

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call Deacon Mark Bardonaro at 471-7741.

Infant Baptisms

Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 471-7741, ext. 0.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Every Saturday, 8:45 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., or by appointment.

Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Epiphany of the Lord

The Irish playwright and poet Oscar Wilde, (fellow Dubliner), wrote: *"To live is the rarest thing in the world. Most people exist, that is all."*

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord which refers to the manifestation of Jesus to the world represented by the three kings. Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." The Gospels paint a truly beautiful and sentimental picture of the birth of the Lord. A miraculous star, angel choirs, shepherds watching over the sheep, the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, sheep, cattle, three wise men (Kings), a humble stable and a lowly donkey. It's the stuff of poetry. And at the center of it all is a small child, a baby, in fact, and that is Jesus. With all the beautiful details, we can be in danger of losing sight of what is being revealed, of what is most important. First, God the Creator of all things, who cannot be held or encompassed by anything He has created, makes Himself a creature, a child, one of us. God, who is pure spirit, or pure being, takes on a created form in flesh – that is what "Incarnation" means, fleshed. Second, God does this because of our need for salvation and, most importantly, and even more astonishingly, because He loves us. This is what is being revealed, manifested, shown forth – God, the uncreated became a creature, and came into the world to save me because **He loves me**.

How should we respond to this love of God? As Wilde observed, many people simply manage to "get through life." Many rarely say what they want to say, do what they want to do, live the life they want to live, or be the people they feel in their hearts they were created by God, to be. Don't get me wrong, I'm not advocating that people simply live as they like in some sort of simple hedonism. To "live" as Wilde suggests, is to realize the full potential of who we are and to overcome the fears that prevent us from being who we are created to be and live the life we are created to live.

The truth is that God created us, and God created us for a purpose. The very reason for being is to be loved by God and to love God. This is our purpose and meaning for being/existing. It is not a simple response to God's love, or two sides of a coin. No! We are created, in our very nature, our very DNA, our very being and our reason for being, is to be loved by God and to love God. When we do this, we will truly know what life is meant to be about, what life truly is, who we truly are. When we live like this we will manifest, or show forth, our true self, that is an Epiphany. That is what God does at the Feast of the Epiphany – He shows forth His true self – a God who is willing to become a creature (child) in order to save the children, He loves.

The proper response to this love of God is to dare to be who God created us to be and live as He created us to live. When we dare to be who God wants us to be, we are making present in the world a gift from God, we are fulfilling our purpose, we are manifesting something God wants to reveal. That is an Epiphany. *"To live is the rarest thing in the world. Most people exist, that is all."* Life is too short to simply just exist – dare to live – dare to be who God created you to be.

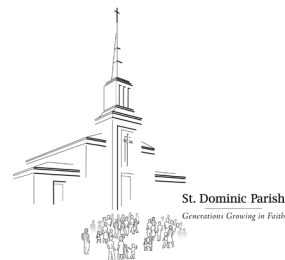

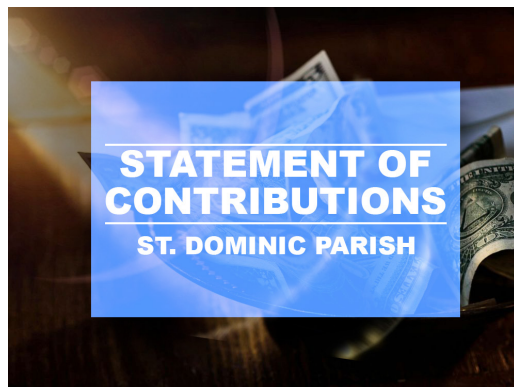

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR – The application process for applying for financial assistance for the 2023-2024 school year is now open. If you have a high school student next year, and you have applied for assistance through FACTS, you do not have to complete the application for your St. Dominic student, as long as you have selected St. Dominic as one of your schools. **PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN YOU HAVE SELECTED ST. DOMINIC AS ONE OF YOUR SCHOOLS.**

To begin the application process, go to: www.factsmgt.com. In the upper left corner of the page, click on “Parent Log In.” If you applied for assistance last year (2022-2023), your login credentials will be the same. If you are utilizing FACTS for tuition payment processing for this current school year, your login credentials are the same. Click on the link, “Apply for Financial Aid.” The instructions for completing the application are relatively intuitive, however, if you experience any issues, please contact FACTS at 866-412-4637.

Awards will first be granted through the Catholic Education Foundation (The Archdiocese of Cincinnati’s One Faith One Hope One Love Campaign). CEF awards will be announced in February 2023. St. Dominic will announce Parish awards in the Spring of 2023. **The deadline to apply for assistance is February 3, 2023 for CEF and St. Dominic Parish Awards. No exceptions can be made!** You will need your 2021 tax return information. You will also have to upload pages 1 & 2 from your 2021 tax return as well as copies of any 2021 W-2s.
