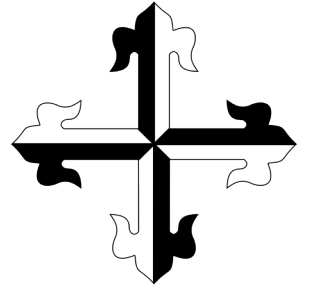

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

INFANT BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually held on the first and second Sunday of each month, except during Lent. Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

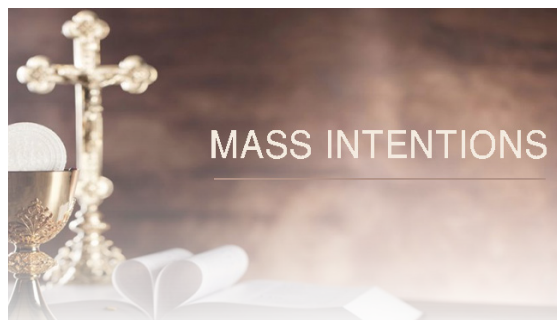

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Corpus Christi

A couple of years ago while walking in the cemetery, I came across a robin chick fluttering around on the grass. Its tail feathers had not yet grown in and one of its claws was a little deformed and not working properly. I watched to see if another bird came back to feed it. I didn't see any bird return to help the little thing. I was tempted to adopt her, but I thought I would wait a day and see what might happen. Of course, I thought, without food the chick won't survive.

Several years ago I read a comment by Cardinal Ratzinger that made a terrific impression on me. He was reflecting on how parents, even Christian and Catholic parents, consider bringing a child into the world as a gift of life from the parents to the child. However, some of them don't have their child baptized, preferring to wait until the child is mature enough to make his/her own decisions about the practice of religion. The Cardinal reflected on how it seemed to him that if parents were willing to give a child human life without the child's consent, and they considered that a great gift, how the gift of God's grace, which is God's life, is an even greater gift than human life. Surely, this is an even greater gift for parents to give to their children – and it is just that – a gift – something we receive not something we take for ourselves.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, celebrates the gift of the Eucharist which is God feeding His children with Eternal and Divine Food. It is the Body and Blood of His Son Jesus. It is essential food for the journey. Just as God fed the people of Israel with Manna in the desert for forty years – food to sustain them on their journey. Now, God feeds us with Bread from Heaven, the New Manna, the Eucharist, to sustain us in our life's journey.

It is unimaginable to us that parents would bring a child into the world and then fail to feed him/her because we know that without food a child will die. The food God gives us in the Eucharist, in the life of faith, is as essential to the life of a child as is the fruit and water of the earth, in fact, it is more essential, for it feeds the soul, the heart, the spirit, the very character of a child. The gift of God's grace, given as food, is the greatest gift of life a parent can give to their child, and it is just as essential, if not more, than any other food we receive. We give children the gift of human life and we teach them how to make their way in the world (walk, talk, dress, read, write, feed). The gift of Divine life, God's life, is an even greater gift and more essential and its ways are also given and taught as a gift and a blessing from parents to their child. We can't imagine not feeding our children the food of this world every day. The food of the heavenly world is a food that lasts forever – let's not fail to give that Sacred Bread to our children also.

One last word; Why do we believe that bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ? It is true that the Church has wonderful theologies exploring this mystery of the faith but the reason we believe is because Jesus tells us so. At the Last Supper Jesus says: "This is my Body, this is my Blood, take and eat, take and drink." He also says: "My flesh is real food, and my blood is real drink, unless you eat and drink, you cannot have life within you." We believe because our Lord teaches us this great mystery and His words are true.

Happily, I saw the little robin chick again, she was doing well, flying a little, and another bird was watching over her.

CENSUS UPDATE

Thank you to all those who have already completed the parish census. All registered parish families who have not yet completed the census should have received a second letter and/or email about updating their information. Registration and updating your parish information is important and necessary for receiving sacraments (weddings, baptisms, funerals, etc.), as well as priority for school registration. Likewise, if you need a letter of suitability attesting to your membership to be a godparent/sponsor, we can only provide a letter if you are a registered member. We ask that you complete this census as soon as possible. Online is the fastest, easiest way, but there are other options outlined in the letter if you prefer not to do it online. 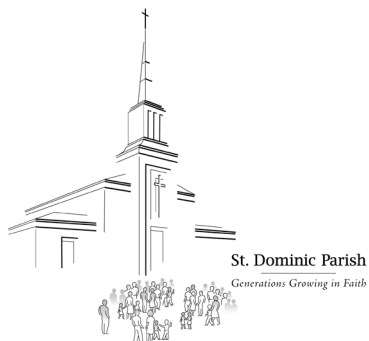
HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES
