#### **Words of Remembrance**

John Ludwig was a beloved usher and greeter at our 9:30 a.m. Mass. A gentle giant. He will be missed. Here are some words of remembrance from his son, Nick.

When I look up "Saintly" in the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, it states "relating to, resembling or befitting a saint." Maybe I am overlooking flaws when I call my Dad saintly.

I first noticed devout acts in the late 1980's after my maternal grandfather passed away. John would treat his Mother-in-law just as well as his mother. He would visit with her weekly, on Fridays, taking the time to talk and provide check balancing services, of course when it was ball season that would change to Saturday. Unknowingly, he was teaching me to serve through example.

Leaders speak up, lecture, and raise awareness for causes. John Ludwig wasn't that, he was a doer.

He was passionate about serving people. He was not about holding a title or about leading meetings. He was a doer. For the Cheviot Fire Association, he would coordinate with local businesses to purchase and deliver gift baskets to families in need. He volunteered for St. Vincent de Paul Society where he was the doer of the shopping and delivering of food to any person in need in the Delhi area, regardless of their denomination. It was never about the recognition but the action. He wasn't a big fan of boasting about the service he provided but rather he just did it.

There are jobs and then there is fulfillment. No one can ever confuse the two when it comes to the relationship between John Ludwig and Bayley Place. Stated even though John was named employee of the year, he could have been employee of the year every day. John would go the extra mile, never denying transportation requests due to the weather or location. John possessed the unique gift of taking the most basic ordinary ride and turning it into something memorable for all.

My father was dedicated to serving. I have only seen John Ludwig cry a few times in life, mainly at funerals. However, a few months back he cried because of a common muscle injury incurred while swimming multiple laps and exercising daily at the age of 70. It was not like he was training for a major event or needed to prepare for an up and coming competition. The training, the weight-lifting the cardio exercise and the lap swimming was for you, for me, for you Mom, for my family, for the church and for the residents and coworkers at Bayley Place. John Ludwig's physical attributes allowed him to serve his family and others. He needed to be healthy, independent and of sound mind and body in order to live his life of service. The disappointment he verbalized was much, much stronger than the physical pain. This acute injury affected his ability to carry out his service to others, especially the residents he befriended from Bayley Place. His simple injury interrupted his ability to fulfill his duty. He was the epitome of "if not me, then who?" Knowing he was unable to serve those who depended on him caused him greater pain and frustration than the physical pain he endured. This brought this great man to tears. I will always remember this when I have a "woe is me" moment.

I have been extremely emotional since my father's death. Being a St. X grad, I truly believe buying the \$35 Elder tie has contributed to these emotions.

John always spoke about experiences at Elder High School and referred to those years as one of the best times in his life. To tell stories of sophomoric fun would be disingenuous to your time and his memory. I'd rather speak about the bonds forged during this time. From the time I was young to his last few days of life, I heard the names of Tim, Bill, Jerry and Mike in many conversations.

My Dad was a kind, loving man yet instilled discipline in me. My Dad and I hugged once. He even said I love you once. It was when I left for Iraq in 2006. It has always been mutually understood that we respected and loved one another. His wisdom wasn't learned in books but through life experiences that he would profess to me in private, usually while we were playing pool or driving together. Fathers, tell your sons you love them, hug them, and kiss them. It's easy and natural to do this with daughters and granddaughters. It's not different with sons. We need to be told you love us.

My father often said, "Don't go cheap on your family." What he meant by this is not lavishing your family with simple material goods but spending time and money on making memorable family vacations. There were only a few vacations growing up, however, I can recall each one and things he said or did to make it memorable.

The best gift I recently received was tickets to the October 5 Notre Dame Football game, given to me by Heidi this year. I got to not only see the game with my Dad, but I had the pleasure to ride with him for 5 hours each way, just talking. These tickets were me saying "I love you. I want to spend time with you and enjoy being around you."

John was a devout Catholic not only judged by attending Sunday Mass and obligation days. He lived and truly believed in the gospel. People knew he was a Christian by his acts of kindness and mercy. He said prayers every morning while he was making breakfast, not for his salvation, but for yours. He found comfort and wasn't afraid of death because of his belief in eternal salvation.


John was an unselfish man who epitomized a sense of piety, devotion and burning desire to serve others.

All Saints Day and my father's birthday now have profound meaning in my life because these days are St. John of Delhi days. We should all be disciples of St. John of Delhi.

#### Financial Assistance For 2020-2021 School Year

The application process for applying for financial assistance for the 2020-2021 school year is now open. If you have a high school student next year, and you have applied for assistance through FACTS, you do not have to complete the application for your St. Dominic student, as long as you have selected St. Dominic as one of your schools. PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN YOU HAVE SELECTED ST. DOMINIC AS ONE OF YOUR SCHOOLS.

To begin the application process, go to: www.factsmgt.com. In the upper left corner of the page, click on "Parent Log In." If you applied for assistance last year (2019-2020), your login credentials will be the same. If you are utilizing FACTS for tuition payment processing for this current school year, your login credentials are the same. Click on the link, "Apply for Financial Aid." The instructions for completing the application are relatively intuitive, however if you experience any issues, please contact FACTS at (866) 412-4637.

Awards will first be granted through the Catholic Education Foundation (The Archdiocese of Cincinnati's One Faith One Hope One Love Campaign). CEF awards will be announced in February 2020. St. Dominic will announce Parish awards in the Spring of 2020. The deadline to apply for assistance is January 31, 2020 for CEF and St. Dominic Parish Awards. No exceptions can be made! You will need your 2018 tax return information. You will also have to upload pages 1 and 2 from your 2018 tax return as well as copies of any 2018 W-2s.
