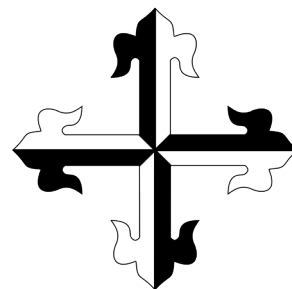

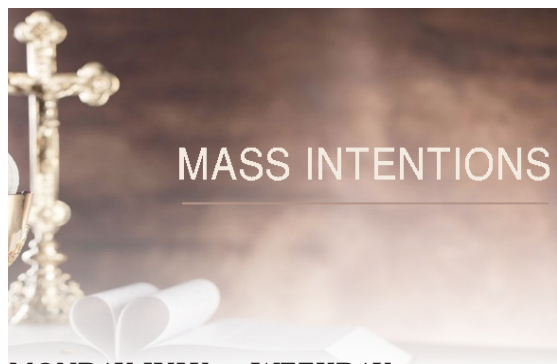

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

“Not everything that counts can be counted, and not everything that can be counted counts.” – William Bruce Cameron

My Dear Friends,

This week's bulletin presents the sacramental and Mass attendance statistics for the period June 1, 2023-June 16, 2024. The statistics give us a glimpse of the life of our family of parishes; however, they only give a glimpse, they don't tell the whole story.

For example, they don't capture the desire of each community to continue in being, they don't capture the vitality of life around here, they don't express the good work that goes on carried out by so many dedicated parishioners. These statistics don't show the amount of charity and love expressed in giving to those less fortunate than most of us. These numbers don't count the number of prayers offered up to the honor of Almighty God and for the intercession of those in need of our prayers and support. These numbers don't account for the hours of coaching on fields, in gyms, on the courts. They don't capture the joy of our children and families, the gratitude of our people. They don't account for the care of the dying, bereaved, homebound, visits to nursing homes and hospitals, Holy Hours prayed, and the sacrifices of parents and families in raising their kids in the faith. They don't account for the toil, anxiety, and pain of the pastor and priests, the staff and the people, struggling to lead in difficult times.

My dear people, all of this is the real story, the hopeful story, the story that matters, and the story that tells us, we are good people doing our best to build God's Kingdom among us. Your sacrifice and commitment, with God's grace, makes all the difference. This is your story, this is what matters, this is what counts!

Numbers are important, they tell us something and they should guide our decisions, but they don't tell the whole story and they are not the most important part of the story. Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus had the power to give life, and we, my dear people, depend on Him for what we need, to find our direction, and to know God's will. We depend on Him and He won't let us down. And you, my dear people, you have never let Him down. God bless you for that!

As we move forward as a family of parishes, we will have to adjust to new realities. The number of people attending church, the number of priests available to us, the cost of upkeep of properties, retirements, staff changes, and statistics might help us in planning. Change is inevitable, and change can be hard and painful, and I have no doubt that will be true for us also. Change is also good as it means that a thing is living, for only living things change. After living among the people of these parishes now for some time, seeing your tenacity, ingenuity, generosity, enjoying your good nature and hard work, I have confidence we can do this, we can do this together, and I hope you will continue to support me as your pastor as we try to discern what God is asking us to do. As I have said before, I plan on our change taking place overtime and slowly, if possible. No need to panic!

And then there were the players! Willie Mays, Stan Musial, Sandy Koufax, Jackie and Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron! The greatest player I ever saw was Willie Mays!

He had the speed and the arm of the Red's Elly De La Cruz. Always an exciting threat on the bases, he batted over .300 for his entire career, and he hit with power! He is among the all-time leaders in home runs, hits, and RBIs, and he missed two years in his prime, doing military service! What a center fielder he was! He played very shallow. But when the ball was hit, he had a gift for knowing where it was going to come down, and he would be there with his patented basket catch. Watching Willie was one of the joys of my youth! I pray he is enjoying playing in the Field of Dreams with Shoeless Joe, Gehrig, and Ruth!
