

Mass Recorded Daily

We will continue to upload a recorded Mass on the weekend for those who are unable to join us in church. Additionally, we will have a recorded Mass Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday uploaded to our website. The weekend Mass will be a recording of the 4:30 Mass on Saturday and will be available on our website by 7:00 p.m. The daily Mass will be a recording of our 7:30 a.m. Mass and should be available each morning.

Revised Guidelines For Attending Mass And Confession At St. Dominic

Guidelines for returning to Mass and Confession from Fr. Jim, Fr. Chris, Deacon Mark, and the Parish Staff.

First, remember that you are dispensed from your Sunday obligation to attend Mass. Your desire to participate in Mass could be fulfilled on any day of the week. We are trusting that no one who is sick is coming to Mass.

On the side of church facing Delhi Pike, only the center doors will be open. The side doors are for exit only. Both doors on the parking lot side of church will be open.

When you arrive at Mass, we expect you to be wearing a mask. (If you are choosing not to wear a mask, please stay home. Wearing a mask, no matter how uncomfortable is for the safety of those you will be worshipping with!)

Upon entering, sanitize your hands from the containers provided and pick up a worship aid. (There will be no hymnals or missalettes.)

Every other pew will be roped off. In the pew, be sure to maintain a six-foot distance between your household members and any others. Look to the left and the right.

No physical contact at the Our Father and Sign of Peace.

At Communion, the Eucharistic Ministers will be wearing a mask. There will only be Eucharist distributed in the hand without contact. No Communion on the tongue. There will be no cups.

When you are in line, we expect you to be wearing a mask and maintaining a six-foot distance to the person in front of you. Receive the host in your hand, lift up your mask and consume the host.

On leaving church, be sure to sanitize your hands and bring your worship aids to discard in the trash cans. We will not reuse them at the next Mass.

Please be charitable as we deal with this situation as a parish family. If you come to church and there is no room in keeping physical distance, do not endanger your health or someone else's by crowding into a pew. The loving thing to do is leave, perhaps come back to another Mass, or during the week, remembering that you are dispensed from the obligation.

Confessions have resumed after the 8:15 Mass. They will take place in the Cry Room. Wait in the center aisle in the rear of church if the door is closed. If it is open, come in. You will have the option of going face to face (at the proper distance) or anonymously. Fr. Chris and I expect that you will be wearing a mask for Confession.

St. Dominic Parish School of Religion (PSR)



The mission of the St. Dominic Parish Community is the same as the mission of the greater Church - to bring about a connection with and response to God's love in our world - and truly live out the Reign of God. We do this through the Sacraments, Scripture, Prayer and our interconnections with others - the family, the Parish community of Faith and the larger community and world.

We welcome all registered parish families whose children attend public schools to attend our Parish School of Religion (PSR). The PSR staff and teachers are here to assist parents in their task of raising their children in the Faith. Instruction in PSR is offered during the school year (September - May) for children in grades 1 - 8. There is special emphasis on the sacramental years, usually 2nd, 7th and 8th grades, with added activities for parents and candidates.

Returning Students Scholarships & Awards:


