What a remarkable service the bereavement ministry offers the parish throughout the year and especially each November with our Memorial Mass. As each name is read, a candle, lit from the paschal candle, is held up. A candle bearing each of their names has been lit from the flame of the Easter Candle to remind us that, although we are without their physical presence, the light of Christ still shines within them and holds us close in His love."

Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.


