## ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY ST. DOMINIC CONFERENCE REPORT

This past quarter, we received a couple of very nice "Thank You" notes from neighbors whom we helped. The neighbors never expected to need to ask for assistance, but they fell on tough times. They were very grateful that we were able to help them weather the bump in their road. It is always nice to hear from the neighbors whom we have helped.

Also, this past quarter, St. Dominic's SVdP was blessed by the efforts of two young parishioners, Andrew and Adam. These two young men (ages 9 and 7) collected canned goods for SVdP from their neighborhood and set up a Kool-Aid/Lemonade stand where they earned over \$100.00 for SVdP.

The total receipts for the third quarter of 2021 were \$13,044.21 from the poor box collections, the parishioner donations via WeShare, the schoolchildren, a very generous benefactor, and the member donations. Since the Federal Covid-19 stimulus benefits have stopped, the calls for help have returned to normal volume in the third quarter.

Because we had a balance in our checkbook, we were able to provide \$15,934.27 in aid to 65 of our neighborhood families made up of 167 adults and children during the time period from July 1, 2021 until September 30, 2021. The breakdown of the aid that was given is as follows:

Rent & Mortgage Assistance	\$ 6,250.00
"Twinning Help" to neighboring SVdP Conferences	\$ 339.00

Remember that our Conference has NO overhead, personnel or office expenses. Every cent that is donated is used to help our neighbors. "The St. Vincent de Paul Society uses money and property to help relieve the suffering of those in need. The Society's funds must be handled with the utmost care, prudence, and generosity. Money must not be hoarded. (Rule 1, Article 3:14). The society has held from the beginning that the funds donated to the conference belong to the poor."

If you wish to make a donation "In honor of" or "in memory of" someone, there are envelopes and donation cards at all the entrances to St. Dominic Church. The gift will be acknowledged by a handwritten note to the recipient. The honoree will know you have honored them with a gift to help the needy in our area.


## BEACONS OF LIGHT: PASTORAL PLANNING FOR OUR THIRD CENTURY
