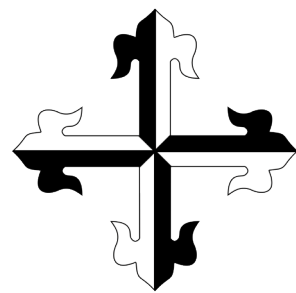

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

“Beloved and true were they in life, and even in death they were not divided.”

You might not be aware of this, but I really like the opera, especially the Italian operas. Although, like golf, I'm a relative latecomer to this passion. I was a student in Rome when I attended my first opera at the famous Rome Opera House with my good friend Fr. Richard Saksons who was also a student priest. I remember Fr. Richard asking me how I thought we should dress. Having never been to an opera before, but presuming it would be highbrow, I said, formal, of course. So, he and I dressed in our best clerical attire, white shirts, cuffs, cuff links, all the stuff. When we got there, he punched me in the arm and called me an idiot because we were the only two fools dressed formally in the whole place. Seemingly, opera is informal in Rome!

The first opera I saw was Don Giovanni by Mozart. The second was Rigoletto by Verdi, my favorite, and I still have the advertisement poster in my house. However, the point of the story is this: high above the Rome Opera House stage is a plaque commemorating the restoration of the Opera House in 1926 by the fascist dictator Mussolini. A similar monument commemorating Mussolini stands in front of Rome's Olympic Stadium. The tomb of one of history's most notorious dictators, Napoleon Bonaparte, lies in Paris and is the focal point of honor and veneration. Westminster Abbey in England is full of the tombs of monarchs who decimated their own people and other nations as they clawed their way to the top of the pile. Throughout history, it was common for the powerful to create a cult of popularity to sway the loyalty of their people. One of the most successful, and most evil, was Adolf Hitler, who managed to make his own name the focus of the formal greeting between people: "Heil Hitler." Even today, governors hang their name above the borders of States, and the likeness of presidents appears in all public buildings. Even after we manage to move them on, they still make their presence known with libraries, statues, airports, and street names. Sound familiar? "Look at me, see how great, how important, I am!"

They are hardly the image of the humble. But to be honest, except for a few monuments, and a line or two in history books or online quizzes, who remembers them and who cares? Yet, in their day, they seemed to the world to be important, powerful, invincible, and even immortal.

Edith and Rosa Stein, were two Jews, abandoned by the world, persecuted by the State (Nazi Germany) and murdered by their countrymen. The same thing happened to other members of their family: Paul Stein, their eldest brother along with his wife, Trude [Gertrude] 1943, at Theresienstadt; Frieda [Elfriede] Stein Tworoger, sister 1942, at Theresienstadt; and Eva Stein, niece 1943.

Humble people before the world and before God – but not overlooked by Him, not forgotten, not abandoned. Edith and Rosa were converts to the Catholic faith. Edith was an incredible philosopher whose life and work were influential to Pope Saint John Paul II. She and her sister became Carmelite nuns: Edith, as a professed nun, Sr. Theresa Benedicta of the Cross, and Rosa, a lay extern/portress. Although they were sent by their Carmelite community from Germany to Holland in 1942, the Nazis caught up with them and deported the two sisters to the prison camps of Amersfoort, Westerbork, and then, finally, Auschwitz where they were martyred on August 9, 1942.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED

Writing about her aunts, Susanne Batzdorff, the niece of Rosa and Edith, and daughter of their sister, Erna, writes:

"After all these years, it is still extremely painful for me to think about the tragic end of Rosa and Edith Stein, but I have wondered whether, in those days and hours of horror and fear, their togetherness may have given them strength and comfort. There is a passage in Jewish liturgy, concerning the slaughter of the martyrs... 'Beloved and true were they in life, and even in death they were not divided.' That is how I picture Rosa and Edith. Alone, Edith could have found asylum in Switzerland, but she refused to accept refuge without Rosa, and in the end, they met death together..." (Susanne M. Batzdorff, Aunt Edith: The Jewish Heritage of a Catholic Saint, Templegate, 1998)

A window depicting the last days of St. Theresa Benedicta based on the last known observation of the Saint and her sister Rosa can be seen at our seminary. A German soldier gave evidence that a train on its way to the death camp at Auschwitz stopped at a platform on the Polish-German border and when he opened the cattle car door, there stood before him, caring for the children within, a Carmelite nun. It was St. Theresa Benedicta.

All over the world, there are images of those who have considered themselves the "great," the "powerful," the "mighty" and the "indispensable" they who have exalted themselves. Leaders have come and gone, they are exalted for a time and then, forgotten. But occasionally, now, and then, we catch a glimpse of those who are truly worth remembering. Occasionally, we see those who are really worth, hearing, following, and who are truly worthy of our admiration and a place of honor not only on earth, but in heaven. These are the humble in the sight of man, but great in the sight of God. These are the ones who have followed the only one who is worthy of our honor, our praise, our longing. They followed the One who was willing to die for them and that made all the difference. Where He led is worth following. Let's strive to be like them.

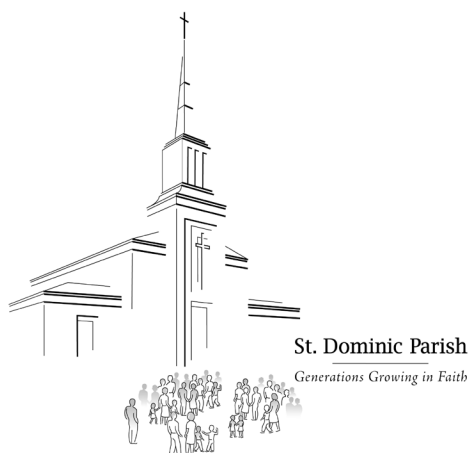

RECEIVE AN OHIO TAX CREDIT

The Catholic Education Foundation for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati (CEF) has been certified by Ohio as a scholarship-granting organization (SGO).

In keeping with the mission of CEF and the regulations of an SGO, CEF-SGO provides financial, need-based scholarships to students in grades K-12 within the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Supporting students and their formation through Catholic Education, is a great way to share our blessings and faith with younger generations. The CEF-SGO may now allow for Catholic Education supporters to be able to receive a tax credit for their generosity.

Ohio taxpayers who donate to SGOs may be able to claim a dollar-for-dollar, non-refundable tax credit on their state income tax return for up to \$750.00 per donor (up to \$1,500.00 if married and filing jointly). (See section 5747.73 of the Ohio Revised Code.)

PLEASE NOTE: According to a representative from the Ohio Department of Taxation, if you file a married joint return, each taxpayer will need to make their own \$750.00 contribution to claim the maximum of \$1,500. Separate acknowledgement letters will be provided for documentation of your gifts.

HOW TO GIVE TO THE SGO: You can make a gift online at CatholicBestChoice.org/SGO or by sending in a check to Catholic Education Foundation-SGO, 100 E. Eighth Street Cincinnati, Ohio 45202.

Consult with your tax advisor to determine (1) your eligibility for the tax credit, (2) its value to you, and (3) the details of your gift. Please understand that each individual's tax situation is different, and we strongly encourage you to reach out to a tax advisor for more information on how an SGO credit could affect your tax liability.
