Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can come to this sacrament which will be communally celebrated annually. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death. Please call the parish emergency line. Someone will respond to your call. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

RCIA

On Sunday, March 6, our Catechumens, Candidates and their sponsors went to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. In the Rite of Election, we acknowledge that God chooses, or elects us, in Christ, to be God's holy people. We are called through Baptism to be members of Christ's body, the Church.

At the Rite of Election, sponsors, catechists and the assembly testified that God has chosen these men and women for Baptism. After listening to the testimony, they are declared to be the Elect in the name of the archbishop. God has chosen them and called them by name; not because they have earned it, but because God wants it!

In the Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion, we recognize that the candidates are already one with us in Baptism, and now wish to be received into full communion of the Catholic Church and fully initiated in the Church. After listening to testimony from sponsors and catechists, the candidates are invited to join us this Lenten Season in a spirit of repentance and conversion as they prepare for Confirmation and Eucharist.

JOIN US AT THE EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil is the high point of the Church's liturgical year. It is also the high point of our worship here at St. Dominic. We invite you to join us for the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. At the Easter Vigil, we recall God's salvation offered to us, from the Passover and the Exodus to the Resurrection, and in our lives today, as we wait for the Lord's return.

The earliest documents concerning the celebration of Easter speak of the preparation for the great feast reaching its peak at a nocturnal liturgy, culminating with the Eucharist.

By the early part of the fourth century, the Easter Vigil also became the supreme baptismal celebration. In his time, St. Augustine called the Easter Vigil the "mother of all holy vigils."

The Easter Vigil is not just a remembrance of the Resurrection, it is an experience of new life in those who are baptized and received into Christ, as well as renewal of the Church itself.

Our parish has traveled the road of conversion alongside the men and women who will be baptized and received into the Catholic Church at the Vigil. Let's continue to support them with our prayers and our presence at the Easter Vigil, when they will share with us for the first time at the Eucharistic Banquet.

The Easter Vigil begins at 8:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 16, when we will gather around the Easter Fire.

HOLY HOUR FOR PEACE

Mondays during Lent we will have a Holy Hour for Peace. We will begin at 6:45 p.m. with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the praying of the Rosary followed by silent prayer. We will conclude the hour with the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Come and join your prayers with our parish as we pray for world peace.

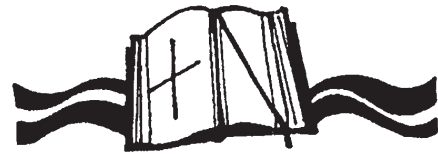
