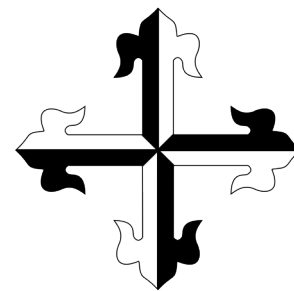

**SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

**CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?**

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

**INFANT BAPTISMS**

Baptisms are usually held on the first and second Sunday of each month, except during Lent. Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY**

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

## FR. BEN'S COLUMN

### Pentecost Sunday

A couple of years ago a young dad stopped me to tell me a wonderful little story he had about his young daughter. He was speaking with his third-grade daughter and somehow the conversation turned to what she might do when she grew up. The little girl told her dad that she wanted to be a nurse. When he asked her why, she said that she “would like to help people” and she thought sick people would need help, she also thought being a nurse would be “a good thing to do with her life.” At this point the man stopped, choked up a little, then he went on: “Father,” he said to me, “she said that she thought that being a nurse and helping people would make Jesus happy and she would like Jesus to be happy.” Wow! How incredible is that! What a great story, what a proud dad, and what a great kid!

The feast of Pentecost was a Jewish celebration before it was a Christian feast. In fact, the apostles of Jesus were in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish feast of Shavuot, the Jewish Pentecost. The Jews celebrated two aspects of their relationship with God at this festival. First was the offering of “first fruits.” In the fields, as soon as the farmer saw the first emergence of one of the seven species of the land – wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranate, olives, or dates – he would tie a string around it, designating it as his first fruits. At the pilgrimage of “first fruits,” Pentecost, the people would come to Jerusalem and present their first fruits to the priests at the Temple, and they, in turn, would offer them to God. The second aspect of the feast was the celebration of the presentation of The Torah (Law) by God to Moses and from Moses to the Jewish people. The Law is the true first fruits for all Jews.

On Pentecost Sunday, God gives to His people the gift of the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is the first fruits of Jesus’ offering and sacrifice. Through the Holy Spirit God showers His gifts upon His people for the sake of the mission of the Church which is the building of the Kingdom. What do we see happen at Pentecost? Well, at the preaching, or invitation of Peter and the apostles, people become members of the Church. In a sense, the first gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit are the people. These people will be the first to believe, and they will pass on their faith to new generations. Together, all these generations will change the world.

We - you and me, have been sent into the world to be a gift. A gift to the people in our lives, the people we meet, and the communities we live in. We also possess gifts that are particular to us but are given to us by God for the sake of all. If we are not living as a gift to others, if we are not using the gifts we have received for the sake of others, well then, we are not living as God expects, as God desires, as God wants, or as we should be living. In truth, we are squandering the gifts and we will have no fruits to offer God or others. We are sent into the world for a purpose – don’t be satisfied with a life that fails to fulfill the purpose God hopes we will achieve.

The little girl is right. Making Jesus happy is a good way to live and a good goal to have in life.

*"If you could see Me there, would you take your eyes off of Me? I am there in that white Host, unseen but very real. Be attentive to My Presence.*

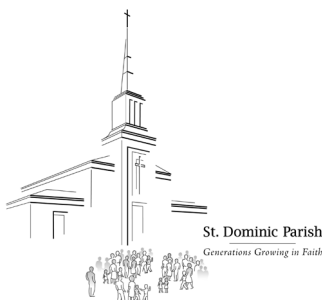
*When you look at the Host you are looking at Love, for it is out of love that I am there, just for you My child, just for each one of My children.*
