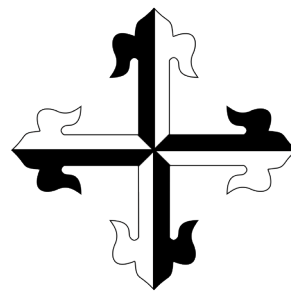

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

“All we have to fear is fear itself” – Franklin Delano Roosevelt

I don't know if it is true or not but there is a great story told about St. Teresa of Avila. It seems that she was traveling and had to cross a river. Halfway across, the bridle on the donkey slipped and the saddle came undone, and St. Teresa, her belongings, and the saddle, all fell into the water. Drenched through, her heavy woolen brown habit and black veil dripping with water she is said to have looked up to heaven and said: “Lord, if this is how you treat your friends, I'm not surprised you don't have many.” I don't know about you, but I have this sort of conversation with God fairly frequently. I can hear myself say things like: “You know, Lord, you could have done that better” or “Here's how you should have done that, Lord.” Or something like: “Lord, why don't you help instead of hinder.” One day I was complaining about God to a priest friend, and I noticed him taking a step or two away and I asked him what he was doing. He said he didn't want to be that close to me because he was afraid the lightning bolt might hit him instead of me. I guess, sometimes, we think we could do a better job than God because we don't understand what God is doing, who God is, or how God works. We fear that God might not be in full control and we think we might be able to do a better job.

A phrase we heard repeated throughout Advent and Christmas was “Do not be afraid.” When appearing to the mother of Samson (Judges 13), who was barren, the angel first said, “Do not be afraid.” When the Angel Gabriel appeared to Zachariah in the Temple in Jerusalem to announce the conception of John the Baptist, his first words were “Do not be afraid” (Luke 1). Then, also in St. Luke's Gospel when the same angel appeared to Mary, his first words were “Do not be afraid.” Jesus uses the phrase several times to both inspire and reassure: When the synagogue official was told that his daughter is dead, Jesus said to him, “Do not be afraid, only believe.” (Mark 5:36). In the midst of the gale on the Sea of Galilee, Jesus called out to the disciples in the boat, “Do not be afraid.” (John 6:20). The phrase “Do not be afraid,” or variations of it like “Do not fear,” appear many times in the Scriptures. Some estimate that the phrase appears three hundred and sixty-five times.

Typically, when we see the phrase “Do not be afraid,” God is actually asking us to “trust me.” In the case of Samson's and St. John the Baptist's mothers, both were old and barren, well beyond childbearing years. They trusted God and what was impossible, God made possible. It was a miracle that the Virgin Mary should conceive, but that God would become man, now that was truly a miracle. Mary believed in both cases and her trust in God changed the world. Trust in Jesus calmed the storm. Trust in Jesus made the blind man see, the deaf hear, the lame walk, the mute speak, lepers cleansed, the possessed delivered from the grip of Satan, sinners converted, loaves and fish multiplied so the hungry would be fed and, most of all, the lost children found and restored to God's life and love. Who would have thought that death on a cross would have brought forth such abundant life!

FR. BEN'S COLUMN CONTINUED

What about us? As we begin the year, it is important to hear that God created you, God loves you, and God sent you into the world to make a difference. Very often, because of this or that, because of the pain we suffered, the indignities we endured, the life we have led, our failures, whatever it may be, often we are afraid. For many of us, we are afraid to be who we were created to be because we fear rejection by others. We, therefore, fear to live life as we should, as we could, as we need to live life. In that case, we live a sort of counterfeit life; it is not without good or merit, but it is not fulfilled. God sent you into the world and the life God created is a blessing to us. We, on the other hand, are to be a blessing to others. We are to be God's blessing. How do we do that – by being who God created us to be, by living as God intends us to live. In this way, through this life, we become a blessing for others.

Fear is a great motivator; it is the one universal power that prevents most of the good that should exist from becoming a reality in our lives and the lives of others. Three hundred and sixty-five times, one for every day of the year, the Bible says, "Don't be afraid." The message from our heroes in Scripture, and history, is that when they trusted in God, great things happened. The Biblical meaning of the name Gabriel is "God is my strength." So, let's begin this year listening to God's message to us: Don't be afraid. Let God be our strength.
