## Knights of Columbus Raffle

The St. Dominic-Delhi Knights of Columbus will be selling tickets for the "K of C Super Cash Bonanza Raffle" after all Masses the weekends of March 9/10 and March 16/17. This is a statewide raffle with over \$100,000 in prizes awarded to twenty-five winners. First prize is \$49,680 (payable over ten years), second prize is \$18,780 (payable over five years), and third prize is \$12,720 (payable over five years). There are another twenty-two cash prizes, all paid out when won, ranging from \$500 to \$4,000. Tickets are \$5 each. All money that the council raises with this raffle will be used for charitable works in the parish and community. Some of the funds from last year's raffle were used for the following: \$250 to purchase and stock the Domestic Church booklet kiosk, \$200 for Christmas gifts for the clergy and parish office, \$100 donated to the seminary in honor of Fr. Jim's 50th anniversary, \$100 to Honor Flight Tri-State, \$66 to rent the Giving Tree delivery trucks, \$200 to help purchase an ultrasound machine for Pregnancy Center West, \$200 to St. Dominic's Vacation Bible School, and \$200 to various youth programs. In total, over \$2,200 will be distributed from last year's raffle and we hope to do even more this year. The Knights thank you in advance for your support

# Lenten Regulations for Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, March 6 and Good Friday, April 19, are days of abstinence from meat and days of fast (that is, limited to a single full meal). Regarding Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled:

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with an uplifted and clear mind. (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)

**The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat**. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (Canons 97 and 1252).

Regarding the obligatory days listed above, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more, rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

# St. Dominic St. Vincent De Paul Society

Thank You to all the parishioners of St. Dominic. Because of your generous donations, from October through December of 2018, the St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul Society helped 72 families, made up of 237 adults and children, in our service area which includes Delhi, Sedamsville and Riverside.

Remember that our SVdP Conference has NO overhead, personnel or office expenses. Every cent that is donated to the St. Dominic SVdP Society is used to help our neighbors. If you wish to make a donation "In honor of" someone, there are envelopes and donation cards at all the entrances to St. Dominic Church. The gift will be acknowledged by a handwritten note to the recipient. The honoree will know you have honored them with a gift to help the needy in our area.

Our total receipts for the fourth quarter of 2018 were \$18,876.31 from the poor box collections, the parishioner, schoolchildren and member donations. Parishioners donated \$1,031 by using the St. Vincent de Paul envelopes included with the St. Dominic Parish envelopes. As always, we thank the St. Dominic schoolchildren for all the food that they donate each month to help us feed our neighbors.

The St. Dominic SVdP Society used your generous donations to provide \$13,891 in aid to our neighbors during the months of October through December of 2018. The breakdown is as follows:
