Mary Lou: A Life of Many Chapters

Our mom liked to read. She really liked to read. The images of Mom through the years almost always include a book nearby: sitting in the family room with a glass of ice water; in her bed with her morning cup of coffee; anywhere, reading, with a grandchild snuggled by her side. Her life could fill a library of a million books. Here we offer a few pieces of her legacy. Just as a great story lives on beyond the final page, so too does our love for Mom.

All families have roots and Grimshaw roots are particularly strong. To be sure, there are many sordid tales of growing up Grimshaw, with two mischievous boys and that rambunctious young girl dubbed "Boop." Mary Lou's journey was a happy one; her road led to Mt. St. Joe's in Cincinnati and to a destined blind date with Len. Mary Lou was a Mountie and she was a quick study in how to become a true west-sider. In their Delhi home, Len and Mary Lou showed that love was in the little things they shared every day. Love was in their holding hands for 54 years.

Our mom taught us early that good friends last a lifetime. She had a contagious laugh and her happy dance was perfected over the years. She raised us with a mantra of responsibilities and privileges. Those two go together, like peas in a pod: Empty the wastebaskets before you watch TV. Our childhood memories are wrapped in sleeping bags, in the way back of the green station wagon, on road trips to Toledo.

Mom also believed in sharing friendship. Only our mother could come home after her first round of chemotherapy, smiling as she described all the nice people she met. Only she could walk through a park in Belgium shouting, "Good Morning!" to bewildered Europeans walking by. We used to think these were random acts of kindness, until we realized there was nothing random about her core belief in the goodness of humanity. She modeled for us the best kind of joy in life.

Mom was a teacher, through and through. The new year began at our house in August, not January. For decades, we would be asked, "Wait, are you Mrs. Hausman's daughter?" And Dad can attest to the fact that trips through Delhi and Sayler Park over the years were forever marked by the question, "Hi, Mrs. Hausman. Do you remember me?" Rest assured, Mrs. Hausman, your students all remember you.

Our kids have been blessed and loved beyond measure by their Grandma. Grandma's pool, Grandma's gumdrops, Grandma's birthday boxes in the mail. Grandma! Grandma! Grandma! is a chorus they have joyfully sung together over the years. Every picture of Grandma with a grandchild radiates an undeniable, everlasting love. When they got a card from Grandma, signed with Love & Prayers, they knew she meant it. Grandma's always right.

Mom was steadfast in her faith. Her faith combated cancer, raised up daughters, and guarded grandchildren. St. Dominic was a second home to her, and she felt wholeheartedly embraced here. Through her generosity of time and spirit, Mom taught us to give before receiving, to give in hardship and joy, to serve something bigger than ourselves.

In her final week, we four girls surrounded Mom with our gratitude and love. We stood in for her extended family and community. We watched with deep wonder as Dad held her hands and whispered his final gift to her. Mom's story now has one more journey home, to a joyful Grimshaw reunion in heaven. And the story carries on beautifully, here on earth, with the birth of her first great-grandson. Little Kayden Marcus has the perfect guardian angel to guide him on his journey.

The second requirement for volunteers is to complete an online background check request. Payment for this is by credit card or "token" at the time of your online request. St. Dominic Parish School of Religion (PSR) Registration for 2019/2020

We will have registration in the Gathering Place after all Masses the weekends of August 3/4 and August 10/11.

The mission of the St. Dominic Parish Community is the same as the mission of the greater Church – to bring about a connection with and response to God's love in our world – and truly live out the Reign of God. We do this through the Sacraments, Scripture, Prayer and our interconnections with others – the family, the Parish

community of Faith and the larger community and world.

We welcome all registered parish families whose children attend public schools to attend our Parish School of Religion (PSR). The PSR staff and teachers are here to assist parents in their task of raising their children in the Faith. Instruction in PSR is offered during the school year (September-May) for children in grades 1-8. There is special emphasis on the sacramental years, usually 2nd, 7th and 8th grades, with added activities for parents and candidates.

Registration for the 2019/2020 school year will be online. All registrations must be submitted by August 30.

Access the online registration form via the Parish Website (www.stdominicdelhi.org). Click on the PSR Registration button on the left side. The cost for grades 1-8 is \$50/per student with a maximum of \$150/per family. All fees are due at registration. A \$10 late fee will be assessed if payment is not made in full by August 30.

The first day of class for all grades (1-8) is Sunday, September 8 at 10:30 a.m.

NOTE: Classes for grades 7 & 8 are moving from Tuesday evenings to Sunday mornings this year.

PSR calendars for grades 1-8 will be available online in July. Complete details are found in the PSR Handbook on the parish website. If you have any questions about PSR you can contact Megan Mattei, PSR Coordinator at mmattei@stdominicdelhi.org or (865) 607-2070.


