FR. BEN'S COLUMN

What defines us as a people and community of faith?

In the early months of the year 2000, I was asked to meet with Bishop Carl Moeddel, God rest his soul, at the Chancery Offices of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. At that meeting, the bishop told me that Fr. Gerry Haemmerle was going to meet with me about being assigned to the seminary. I told the bishop I didn't want to go to the seminary as I was happy working at the parish. He said that I didn't have to go to the seminary if I didn't want to, but he would like me to meet with Fr. Haemmerle anyway. This is the sort of thing bishops say when they are going to appoint you no matter what. I had lunch with Fr. Gerry Haemmerle and told him that I didn't want to go to the seminary, but I appreciated the offer. I was appointed to the faculty of Mount St. Seminary by Archbishop Pilarczyk in July 2000. Previously, I had served at parishes in Dayton and Sidney, Ohio, so this was my first experience in Cincinnati and when I arrived there, I knew no one and, except for my dog Cú Chulainn (Cookie for short), I was completely alone.

On the second day in Cincinnati, I received a phone call from a priest in the Diocese of Covington. He told me that some Cincinnati priest friends of his had told him I had just arrived and that I was new to town. So, he called to invite me to lunch. That was twenty-two years ago, and we are friends to this day. Cincinnati would have been a lonely place without that kind welcome and friendship.

Moses welcomes guests, strangers, and treats them as friends and his welcome, his graciousness and generosity, is rewarded with new life. Mary sits at the feet of Jesus and listens to Him and to this day her graciousness, her welcome, her affection for the Lord is remembered and is considered a lesson to us of what is important and essential.

In the next few months and years, we are going to be very busy with one thing or another trying to form a new community of faith amid already established communities of faith. The potential for us to lose sight of what is important, what is essential, is great. You might ask: What is important? I think three things are most important: First, the Lord. Let's surround our efforts with speaking and listening to the Lord. In prayer, worship, and Adoration, we will discern the Lord's will for our community. So, let's surround our efforts with prayer, both individually and as a community. Second, let's welcome each other so that we all have a place to be and a community to belong to. The temptation is to remain defensive and protective of what we have, who we are, and where we have come from. While we value all of this, we cannot be limited by our past or our present. We must think big and bold. We should welcome each other so we become the family we like to think we are. When people are welcomed, when they feel they have friends, when they belong, then they offer what they have and share with others making a family stronger and sweeter. Nobody is to be left on the side of the road. Third, our mission is not to build parishes, or a parish, but to build the Kingdom of God. Places and programs help, but they are not more important than people. Let's focus on serving God, the Lord, and His people. Prayer, welcome, and mission should define us. We believe in our future, and with God's grace, we can build together and make things happen.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Sacrament of Matrimony

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.


