Carolyn A. Robben Eulogy

We lost a pillar of our parish last month. Carolyn Robben was everybody's mom. It is inspiring to see how her children honored her with words of remembrance at her funeral.

Mom, Mamma

Thank you all for being here today to honor our Mother, Mamma (the name she was called by her grandchildren) and Friend, Carolyn (Leussing) Robben who was born to Martha and Stanley Leussing on October 16, 1935.

She and her sister, June were raised in Norwood, Ohio. They spent many childhood days at a summer cottage playing tennis and ping pong and making lifetime friends. The legacy of cottage park is still carried on by her nephew, Ed Imm and his family.

While attending St. Matthew School, mom met her best friend Dolores Hoff, who eventually became her sister-in-law, Dolores Robben.

In 1955, this Norwood girl, named Carolyn fell in love with a Delhi boy, named George. They married on October 6, 1956 and over the years, the nest was complete with five robin birds.

Mom was supportive to the family business. She was a loving and faithful wife, daughter and mother. Many evenings were spent doing wedding consultations with future brides and their mothers at the kitchen table of our family home. She enjoyed working on the financial books behind the scenes of the florist business; definitely letting our father shine. Mom was our connector for the family.

At family parties or on Sunday afternoons, you could find Mom wanting to play a good card game of Five Hundred or Polish Hearts with her family and friends. Her favorite game was Chinese Checkers; no one could beat her. Mom enjoyed this game the most because it gave her quality one on one time with her children and grandchildren.

A star has five points and Mom has five children. She always made us feel like a star that shined bright. She had the biggest heart for the love of God and family. Thank you, Mrs. Sunshine for being our star. We love you and promise to stay together as a family and now you can square dance with Dad in heaven.

Ironically, on the day of mom's passing, a storm was coming (and she does not like storms); both my sister from Columbus and my siblings here saw a rainbow. We knew that this was a sign that mom was received in heaven and found her pot of gold.

Mom, Mamma - Carolyn A. Robben - A woman of Faith

Mom or mamma was a woman of extraordinary faith. She strived to instill a love and respect for the Catholic faith within each of her five children's lives and their families. Mom's faith was steadfast. She lived it and shared it.

Growing up, first thing in the morning, mom reminded us to say our prayers and shared with us what saint's feast day it was, so we knew when the nuns asked in religion class. Thank you, mom, for helping us get that extra credit in religion.

Frequently, she would lead us in a family Rosary. In later years, she and dad would pray a decade for each of us and our families, according to the day of the week. Bettie on Monday, Beverly on Tuesday, Dianne on Wednesday, Kimberly on Thursday and Ron on Friday. Just recently, she provided us with four Lenten prayers for her family to recite during Lent.

She encouraged us to incorporate faith not just in our lives, but in the moments of every day. As her health declined, her faith did not. When mom could not attend daily Mass, she turned on EWTN to participate in the daily Mass and pray the Rosary. If any of you called her at that certain time, she may have said, "It's time for the Rosary, call me later"; and we did.

We would like to commemorate mom or mamma in a special way;

We asked ourselves "What would mom or mamma do for that special occasion?" – with a pen in her hand and a dictionary by her side, she would compose a poem that contained two lines that rhymed. We felt that it would be most fitting to do the same:

Dear Father in Heaven, we give you today,

mother, grandmother and friend, who's faith never strayed.

She counted all her blessings from God above

Because her heart felt; YOU were her FIRST LOVE!

Her gentle soul, who longed to see YOUR face.

In the hope, that she would dwell in Thy Holy Place.

Now she is resting, safely in your arms,

Where there is no more suffering and no harm.

We thank you Lord for You are good,

Your love is everlasting.


2019 Wedding Anniversaries

St. Dominic St. Vincent De Paul Society

Thank You to all the parishioners of St. Dominic. Because of your generous donations, from January through March 2019, the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Dominic helped 53 families, made up of 171 adults and children, in our service area which includes Delhi, Sedamsville and Riverside.

Remember that St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul Conference has NO overhead, personnel or office expenses. Every cent that is donated to the St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul is used to help our neighbors. If you wish to make a donation "In honor of" someone, there are envelopes and donation cards at all the entrances to St. Dominic Church. The gift will be acknowledged by a handwritten note to the recipient. The honoree will know you have honored them with a gift to help the needy in our area.

St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul's total receipts for the fourth quarter of 2019 were \$9,773.00 from the poor box collections, the parishioner donations, the schoolchildren, and the member donations. Special "Thanks" to Steve Walter. Because of Steve's initiative and determination, the Parker Hannifin Corporation made a generous donation of \$1,000.00 to the St. Vincent de Paul at St. Dominic. Parishioners donated \$2,258.00 by using the St. Vincent de Paul envelopes included with the St. Dominic Parish envelopes. As always, we thank the St. Dominic School children for all the food that they donate each month to help us feed our neighbors.

Because there were funds left over from previous quarters, SVdP at St. Dominic was able to provide \$12,058.49 in aid to our neighbors during the months of January through March of 2019. The breakdown is as follows:

Requirements for Those Volunteering with Children

As a reminder, all volunteers are required to attend one VIRTUS live training session. You can attend this training at any location at a date/time that works best for you. Preregistration is required. Find training locations, registration details and steps to create your VIRTUS user account at www.VIRTUS.org.

The second requirement for volunteers is to complete an online background check request. Payment for this is by credit card or "token" at the time of your online request. Contact the organization for which you volunteer to get information on obtaining a token for payment. To initiate the online background check, sign in to your VIRTUS.org user account, click the "Toolbox" tab then click the selection.com background check link.
