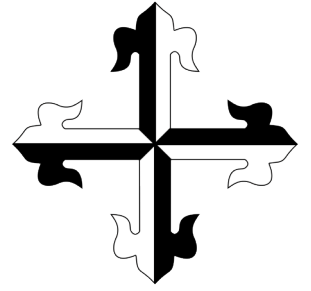

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the Parish Office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death by calling the parish emergency line. Please inform the Parish Office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

CONSIDERING BECOMING CATHOLIC?

RCIA is the process through which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. The process provides for different levels of entry. To obtain more information, call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

INFANT BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually held on the first and second Sunday of each month, except during Lent. Attendance at a Parent Pre-Baptism Session is required. Call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

FR. BEN'S COLUMN**God our Loving Father**

I have been away from Ireland for over thirty years now. I try to get home at least once a year to visit with my family and friends. I enjoy seeing my mother, brothers, nieces and nephews, friends, and, I almost forgot, my sisters. I always make a visit to my father's grave. It's always nice to be home, at least on the first day, when everyone makes a fuss over you, and they are happy to see you. After the first day, things get back to normal and you are just like part of the furniture. It's as if you have never been away. I'm alright with that, home is home, and it's good to just be there, to fit in, and enjoy the life that goes on around you.

Although we don't read this Gospel story this year, one of the major images during Lent are the figures of the prodigal son, the older brother, and their father. The prodigal son returned, and his father was so happy to see him and to have him back in the safety of his home and family. To belong to a family is a tremendous gift – one that not everyone has and one that not everyone experiences. The prodigal son was fortunate to have such a welcoming and generous father. Even though he had sinned against his father, walked away, and turned his back, squandered his inheritance, and lost his dignity and honor, his father still loved him. This is what fathers are supposed to be like, this is what they are supposed to do. A father is still a father no matter what his children are like.

All of us are fortunate to have such a father in a gracious and loving God. He waits for us. He patiently looks to the horizon hoping for our return. He gives us everything, especially His own heart and life itself. Although we sinned against Him by failing to be good sons/daughters, He does not sin against us by being a bad, petulant, or hard-hearted Father. If He sees us return, He, God, runs out to meet us, to embrace us, to love us, to forgive us. No matter what, God remains a Father and our failings do not change His nature.

It's interesting here at our parishes, because I see this sort of love displayed every day by members of our communities. Of course, there are always those who are like the older son/brother, the bitter, the noise makers, the whiners and groaners always lifting their voices in complaint, tightfisted and hard-hearted. They give nothing and close themselves off to receiving anything. But there are those who "father" and "mother" their own and other people's children by providing for them, supporting them, watching out and caring for them. I see them coach in our gyms and on the fields, gather in a harvest of food to feed and clothe the poor. They pray every day at the Great Sacrifice of the Mass for the souls and good of others, they clean the Churches, they turn up to help with special projects, they run clubs, they teach in the school, the PSR program, and RCIA. They visit the sick and homebound, they care for their priests like a family, because you are our family. Every day, the love of the Father is made present in our midst. That's what a parish is supposed to be – a family – especially for those who don't have a family.

There are plenty of prodigal sons and daughters out there. Thanks for being a caring father and mother, thanks for being a family to us.

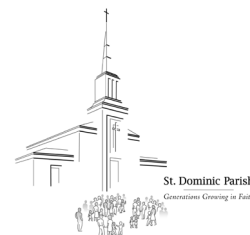
CELEBRATION OF THE FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH

Our St. Joseph celebration will take place on Saturday, March 16. We will begin serving dinner at 5:30 p.m. The St. Joseph Table tradition began in Italy in the Middle Ages, as a way of honoring and thanking St. Joseph for his intercession. If you have a devotion to St. Joseph or have asked him to intercede, come and join the celebration in his honor. Of course, you don't need to have a special devotion to St. Joseph to join us for a great time. Since the St. Joseph dinner is on Saturday and the rules of abstinence do not apply as they did in Italy when the tradition began, we will be serving meatballs with the meal, even though the purest of St. Joseph Day celebrations continue to be meatless.

Due to the nature of the dinner, and the overwhelming response in the past, we need to know who is attending, and we do find it necessary to limit the number, so please call the Parish Office at 513-471-7741, ext. 0 as soon as possible to reserve a place. ST. DOMINIC-DELHI KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The St. Dominic-Delhi Knights of Columbus will be selling chances for the "K of C Super Cash Bonanza" after all Masses this weekend March 9/10 and next weekend March 16/17. 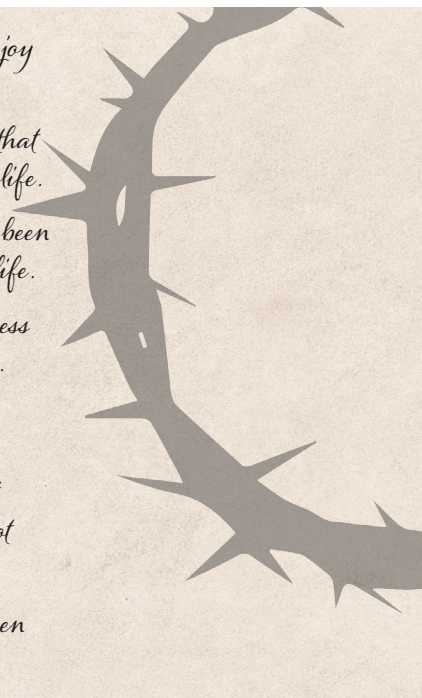
