KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS

In July of 2019, St. Dominic-Delhi Council will celebrate their seventh anniversary at St. Dominic Parish. Since then the Knights have provided hundreds of hours of service to the parish and community and have distributed over \$12,000.00 in charitable funds. These funds have supported parish programs such as Vacation Bible School and the parish festival; community programs such as the Delhi Skirt Game and veteran's events; Pro-Life programs such as donations to Pregnancy Center West and assisting in the purchase of an ultrasound machine; and youth programs such as the Keep Christ in Christmas poster contest and the Special Population Free Throw Contest at Rost School.

The Knights are always looking for good men to join them in their mission of charity, fraternity, unity, and patriotism. They hold their business meeting the first Tuesday of the month and a social meeting the third Tuesday of the month. The social meetings include guest speakers or family events that are open to everyone. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. Weddings are not scheduled during Advent or Lenten Seasons. A marriage preparation program is required.

**ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY
ST. DOMINIC CONFERENCE**

Thank you to all the parishioners of St. Dominic. Because of your generous donations, from October through December of 2018, the St. Dominic St. Vincent de Paul Society helped 72 families, made up of 237 adults and children, in our service area which includes Delhi, Sedamsville and Riverside.

Remember that the St. Dominic SVdP Conference has NO overhead, personnel or office expenses. Every cent that is donated to St. Dominic's SVdP Society is used to help our neighbors. If you wish to make a donation "In honor of" someone, there are envelopes and donation cards at all the entrances to St. Dominic Church. The gift will be acknowledged by a handwritten note to the recipient. The honoree will know you have honored them with a gift to help the needy in our area.

Our SVdP total receipts for the fourth quarter of 2018 were \$18,876.31 from the poor box collections, parishioners, school children, and member donations. Parishioners donated \$1,031.00 by using the St. Vincent de Paul envelopes included with the St. Dominic Parish envelopes. As always, we thank the St. Dominic school children for all the food that they donate each month to help us feed our neighbors.

St. Dominic's SVdP used your generous donations to provide \$13,891 in aid to our neighbors during the months of October through December of 2018. The breakdown is as follows:

Rent & Mortgage Assistance: \$4,435

Duke Energy: \$3,282

Water Bills: \$1,503

Food and Remke & Kroger Gift Cards: \$2,846

Beds, Walmart Gift cards and other Services: \$1,825

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR –

The application process for applying for financial assistance for the 2019-2020 school year is now open. If you have a high school student next year, and you have applied for assistance through FACTS, you do not have to complete the application for your St. Dominic student, as long as you have selected St. Dominic as one of your schools. *PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN YOU HAVE SELECTED ST. DOMINIC AS ONE OF YOUR SCHOOLS.*

To begin the application process, go to www.factsmgt.com. In the upper left corner of the page, click on “Parent Log In.” If you applied for assistance last year (2018-2019), your login credentials will be the same. If you are utilizing FACTS for tuition payment processing for this current school year, your login credentials are the same. Click on the link, “Apply for Financial Aid.” The instructions for completing the application are relatively intuitive, however, if you experience any issues, please contact FACTS at (866) 412-4637.

Awards will first be granted through the Catholic Education Foundation (The Archdiocese of Cincinnati’s One Faith One Hope One Love Campaign). CEF awards will be announced in February 2019. St. Dominic will announce Parish awards in the Spring of 2019. **The deadline to apply for assistance is January 31, 2019 for CEF and St. Dominic Parish Awards.**

No exceptions can be made! You will need your 2017 tax return information. You will also have to upload pages 1 & 2 from your 2017 tax return as well as copies of any 2017 W-2s.
