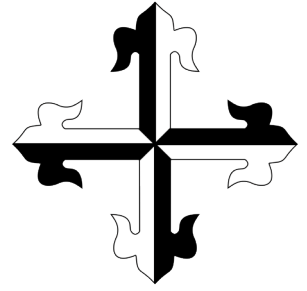

FR. BEN'S COLUMN

Have you ever seen the movie “Jerry McGuire?” If you have not, don’t bother; it’s rubbish. One of the threads of the movie is the romantic relationship between Jerry McGuire, played by Tom Cruise, and Dorothy Boyd, played by Renee Zellweger. At one point in the movie, Jerry says to Dorothy: “You complete me.” It is a truly terrible line and indicates a complete failure to understand the nature and limits of human relationships.

However, it is not an unfamiliar expectation that couples have of each other these days. Many people enter marriage, or relationships, expecting, somehow, that the other person will bring not just happiness, companionship, and friendship, to the relationship, but somehow, they expect them to bring fulfillment and completion to their lives. “You complete me!” Not only is it a stupid sentiment, it is complete crap! Another human being cannot complete you because you were not created for another human being. Many people, holding onto this expectation of the spouse and marriage are putting an unrealistic expectation on their relationships. It is an expectation that is impossible for them to fulfill and so an expectation that will, inevitably, lead to a sense of failure, of being incomplete, unfulfilled in our marriages and, very often, our lives.

The old Baltimore Catechism begins with two fundamental questions concerning human life and purpose: “Who made you?” and “Why did God make you?” The answer to the first is simple: “God made me.” The answer to the second is a little more complicated: “God made me to know, love, and serve Him in this life and to be with Him forever in the next life.” It is a great answer, but incomplete. We should add: “God made me because He loves me and wants me to experience that love now and in eternity.” Then the rest of the answer: “God made me to know, love....”

God made Adam and Eve, to love them and to be loved by them. This is the purpose and goal of life. We are created for communion, a relationship, with God. We are created for God’s love, and only God’s love can fulfill, satisfy, and complete us. If we are not living in God’s love, then, we are existing, but we are not living. If we are not searching for God, then we are on the wrong path. If we are not listening to God’s voice calling us, well then, we are listening to another, and that voice is a lie. Only God can complete us.

When Adam and Eve listened to other voices, they walked away from God’s love. But God did not abandon them, rather, He gave them the Law. The Law was a way to enter, once again, into a relationship with God. In the Gospel today, Jesus says He has not come to abolish the Law but to fulfill it – to bring it to completion. The Law was “the way” the people of Israel could remain united to God, pure, holy, righteous. Now Jesus says of Himself: “I am the Way, and the Life, and the Truth.” He is the fulfillment of the Law because in Him and through Him we can once again find God and experience His love.

In The Beatitudes, Jesus challenges the way we understand what is important in life. These are His commandments, His Law, His way to find meaning and purpose in life. They are also the recognition of what God values. In today’s Gospel message, it may seem that Jesus speaks in radical terms, but He is not. Jesus is asking us to change what we value, the things we honor, the way we measure success and the purpose of life. Is that radical? Maybe, but let’s ask ourselves: Who wants to marry someone who is not completely committed to them and absolutely in love with them? Who wants to marry someone if we are not truly and completely in love with them? It is the same with our relationship with God. God enters into this relationship in an absolute way, and He hopes for the same kind of response from His beloved. We are created for this sort of love, Divine Love, God’s Love, and only this Love will fulfill us. Marriage, family, career, excess, power, cannot fulfill us because we are made for something greater. We are made for God. Why enter into life unless we are going to take

it on radically, completely, embracing the way God wants us to live. Surely, any compromise on this is to live a half-life, an incomplete life, a shadow of a life.

So, what about marriage? The nuptial blessing in the marriage rite says that "marriage is a gift from God." God loves us so much He does not want us to be alone, so he gives us companions for the journey of life. It is the ministry of spouses to help each other be the people God created us to be, live the life God asks us to live, and find our way to the destiny He has in store for each of us. We cannot complete each other, but we can help each other find our way to the One who can complete us. In life, we are given companions on the way, and we are asked to be companions to others. The Beatitudes as a way of life are not easy, but they are worthwhile. Those who live them truly know God and make Him present. ✚

**FR. JIM'S REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL,
SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME.**

Fr. Jim had been talking about including his Gospel Reflections in the bulletin for the past few months. Before his passing, he submitted his reflections for the remainder of the year. We will continue to share his reflections each week.

One of the blessings of being in parish work, unlike my previous assignments, is that often I get to accompany folks as they struggle with terminal illness and approach death. It is especially inspiring to me when the person has a strong faith and trust in God. I remember especially a woman by the name of Toni. As she was dying, she had concerns about her family, but there was deep peace about her. Despite her pain and a body that was failing her, she was in touch with a deeper reality. She spoke of her trust in God's goodness, graciousness, and mercy. Remembering that experience, I realize that Toni understood something of Jeremiah's prophecy in the first reading: "A blessing on the one who puts her trust in the Lord!" She was blessed with the grace of living in that deeper awareness. God is present! God is gracious and loving! It all has a happy ending!

Looking back, I also realize that Toni also understood the deeper reality Jesus is getting at in The Beatitudes. "Blessed are you poor." People can be poor in many ways. Some people are poor in possessions and financial resources. Others are poor in talents or education. Toni was poor in terms of health. Why are the poor blessed? Because the poor are less likely to think that possessions or talents or their health will save them. They are less likely to put their trust in what they have. They are more likely to look upon what they have as a gift, to be held in trust, and to be used in service of others. The poor are blessed because they are less likely to deceive themselves with the illusion that they are self-sufficient. They are more likely to be in touch with that deeper reality: We depend on God for all that we are and have! They are more likely to be hungering for union with Jesus Christ. Blest are those who hunger!... or as St. Augustine so eloquently puts it: "Our hearts are restless Lord, until they rest in Thee."

The blessing or the grace that they have is a peacefulness that comes from trusting in the Lord!... trusting in the Lord's love...and graciousness...and mercy! Trusting that because of Jesus, even death is a blessing...a transition...a passage from this life into eternal life!

Looking back, I realize that Toni...and many others in the parish like her...have fulfilled Jeremiah's prophecy: "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord!"

Sisters and brothers, let's take a moment...and in the silence of our hearts...let's address the Lord Jesus...and once again place our trust in Him.
