BEACONS OF LIGHT – FAMILY OF PARISHES UPDATE AND IMPORTANT NEWS

Archbishop Schnurr has requested that all parishes in the Family of Parishes be "one vibrant, thriving canonical parish by July 1, 2027." The archbishop has also indicated that the Beacons of Light process should take time to discern the best way forward for each family of parishes. The joining of parishes is a canonical issue (following church law), while the form, character, and ministerial priorities, are pastoral issues.

The following seven Vision Team Ad Hoc Committees have been established and are already working, to help develop a strategic plan as part of the Beacons of Light process for the Family of Parishes. Our Family of Parishes Vision Team process will now move forward with the Ad Hoc committee stages. This stage will take some time, possibly a year or more. The committees will formulate recommendations and suggestions concerning their particular principal area of concern. The Ad Hoc committee teams have between 10-12 members, made up of Vision Team members, staff, parishioners, parish committee and ministry members, drawn from all five parishes. Each committee will move at its own pace and will complete work at different stages and times. If appropriate or necessary, and after consultation and consideration, we may implement some initiatives as they are recommended while others will come into force only when we establish a single parish. It seems wise and prudent not to rush the process at too fast a rate, as priorities, or situations, over time may shift.

The "parameters" of the Beacons of Light process make it clear that the Beacons process is not about reforming the Church or transforming her doctrine and discipline. We are required to work within the Church's legal, moral, ethical, and doctrinal framework. The Beacons of Light process is about visioning, evangelizing, and reorganizing our archdiocese and parish communities. Our task is practical, aspirational, and visionary, and all these elements run concurrently. We must deal with practical and visionary issues, and in this, we must be realistic. Goals and vision must be reasonable, and they should be achievable. We must also work within the means, resources, and viability of each parish community.

During and after the Ad Hoc committee stage, there will be an opportunity to review the work of each committee, its recommendations, evaluate, consult with parishioners, and refine our strategies, goals and long-range plans. We are not looking to the committees to manage every aspect of parish life, but to give attention to how we bring our communities together to better achieve our mission in building the Kingdom of God and forming disciples. Keep in mind that the regular life of our parishes continues, and Beacons, while a priority, is also an extra for all parish staff, missions, ministries, parishioners, and priests.

NO MASS SCHEDULE CHANGE THIS YEAR

At present, we are very fortunate to have three assigned priests and two retired pastors who have agreed to remain active for our Family of Parishes. We also have several very generous retired priests who are willing to celebrate Mass for our Family of Parishes. This means that for the foreseeable future, there is no need for an immediate change to our Mass schedule. Unless there is a drastic change in circumstances, I'm not considering any major change to the Mass schedule for the coming year.

However, the Beacons process has required that we build our future Mass schedule around the availability of three assigned priests, each of whom can only celebrate two Masses on Sunday. ST. DOMINIC CHURCH CINCINNATI, OHIO

PARISH AND FINANCE COUNCILS

For this coming year, each parish will retain its own parish council, finance commission, and financial independence. Parish finances remain independent for each parish in our Family.

PSR, RCIA, AND BAPTISM PREPARATION CLASS

The Parish School of Religion Program for St. Dominic Parish will continue at St. Dominic for the coming year and the OLV, St. Simon, St. Al's, and St. Vincent de Paul program will continue at St. Simon. Both programs take place on Sunday mornings.

RCIA and Baptismal preparation programs have been consolidated for all five parishes and take place at St. Dominic.

LET ME BE CLEAR ON SOME IMPORTANT POINTS:

I said at the very first Mass at the beginning of this journey together that if there is news to tell you, I will tell you, and that anything else you hear is rumor. That has not changed. If there is something important to communicate, be assured, you will hear it from me. I have no problem making my voice heard and you will hear it loud and clear. Two of the favorite areas of gossip are parish closings and Mass times. As you can see from this information, there is no plan to close parishes and Mass times will remain the same for the coming year. Both things may change, but if they do, you will hear it from me — I guarantee that.

Just like you, I have heard from the archbishop, and those who are leading the Beacons of Light process, that this initiative is not about "closing parishes," but about renewal. This does not guarantee that parishes will not be closed, but if they are, it seems to me that there would be clear criteria for closing a parish. To my mind those criteria would include, but may not be limited to, these areas: The availability of priests to maintain a Mass and sacramental schedule; The necessity of the site (church, other buildings, and ground) for the mission of Mary, Queen of All Saints Parish; The viability of the church community at a particular site (numbers attending Mass, maintenance and condition of the plant, no debt or appropriate debt repayment plan, no substantial deferred maintenance); Sustainability, the commitment of the particular church community to financially support the church and provide for its ministries now and in the future; Reasonable expectations and prudent use of resources (for example: does it make sense to have two Sunday Masses at a church when the combined number of those present for both Masses is less than 300 people? Is it a good use of resources to maintain/repair a church, campus, staff, and priest, when less than 300 people attend two Sunday Masses?).

I understand that people have been talking about what they consider the "inevitable" closing of some of the churches in our Family of Parishes. It is not my intention as pastor of our Family of Parishes to close any churches (parishes). However, this does not mean that churches won't be closed. I, as the pastor, can only do what is feasible and reasonable. and our future depends on God and you, even more than me. Certainly, all our churches/parishes will experience change in the coming years not only because of necessity, but because of our focus on mission and excellence. A church will close if the people no longer have the will, desire, means, or ability to keep it open, or, if it is determined that it is no longer necessary for the sake of the mission, or reasonable to keep it going. However, the people of each church/parish, and the people of the family of parishes, will be engaged in any conversations and decisions about closing churches if such a conversation becomes necessary. The level of commitment at each church will be one of the most essential elements in maintaining the viability and the future of that church and determining its future. Another will be the availability of priests to serve our communities and parish.

Lastly, we are engaged in a Holy work, the work of Jesus, the work of God. All such work should be surrounded by prayer, so, please, please, make it part of your daily prayer to ask God to bless our work, our parishes, our families, our people, our priests, so that we may do God's will, in a way that is compassionate, kind, and faithful. God hears our prayers, so let's ask Him to make us not just successful, but faithful.


