FR. BEN'S COLUMN

We are all sent to be good shepherds.

Then His Grace, Archbishop Schnurr, appointed me pastor of Our Lady of Victory, I received a great bundle of papers containing all sorts of information about the parish. Among the material was the results of a survey that had been carried out. It was clear from the responses that the parishioners of Our Lady of Victory saw Catholic education as a priority. They didn't frame it that way, though. In fact, most responses said things like: "No matter what, keep our school open." "Make sure the next pastor knows that our school is a priority." "I hope the Archbishop appoints a priest that is committed to keeping our school open." This was from people who have kids in the school, who have had kids in the school, and those who have never had kids in the school. It was clear that almost all the people of Victory love and support their school.

Two years ago, I was appointed to shepherd our Family of Parishes and two things I heard very clearly from almost everyone was the regret that St. Al's and St. Vincent de Paul schools closed and that it is a priority to keep St. Dominic and Our Lady of Victory schools open and thriving. It is clear that Catholic education, our schools, and our children, are a priority for the people of our parishes. Just so we don't seem to overlook them, the same is true for our Parish School of Religion (PSR) and developing youth programs. "Jesus took a child and placed him in their midst." We know that we are to make sure our little lambs are the focus of our mission as shepherds.

It is a great joy for me, and our other priests, to walk through the schools, or celebrate our school Masses, walk around the grounds, and hear the laughter, joy, and greetings of so many wonderful children. And, my dear friends, you have outstanding children. They are creative, funny, generous, kind and seem so happy. Everywhere I go I hear a joyful greeting "Hi, Fr. Ben!"

I want to thank you for all you do as a parish, and now a family of parishes, to keep our Catholic school not only open, but alive, active, energetic, creative, faithful, vibrant, and growing. We have great schools! And our schools have been and will continue to be a priority in our mission as a parish. The fact that we have schools here at Victory and Dominic, the fact that St. Vincent and St. Al's saw it as a priority to keep their schools open for as long as possible with great sacrifice, is really a credit to all of you and your hard work, determination and your commitment to the Catholic faith, Catholic education and the sacrifices you are willing to make to ensure that our children have an outstanding education and an opportunity to attend a faith-filled, and faithful, Catholic school. I would like to see the day when it is possible for all our children, despite financial barriers, to have the opportunity of attending our beloved schools. Why?

Because our schools are a treasure, a pearl of great price that are worth sacrificing to have. Catholics have always understood that education is important, and education includes the body, mind, spirit, and soul. We have always striven to provide a great grounding in the essentials—reading, writing, math, science, as well as the creative arts such as music, drama, and art and a vibrant sports education. But more that this, Catholic education has sought to raise the child's mind to the greater and higher things: faith, charity, love, and not only knowledge of God, but

a relationship with God and love of God and neighbor. Catholic education strives to form the character of a child, the heart, to build courageous young men and women of faith, with values that last a lifetime and that will benefit humanity. We strive to form boys and girls into heroic, courageous, tenacious and joyful people who will be the fathers, mothers, priests, husbands, wives, the leaders of the future – full of integrity, vision and hope.

This is what Catholic education is about and this is what our schools, education programs and youth ministry is about. This is what you provide because this is what you are about and such a school, such a parish, such a people, such a future is worth sacrificing for. So, thank you for all you do to provide schools, programs, parishes, and education for our children.

Jesus took a child and placed him in their midst and putting His arms around him said: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me." We have lots of children who need to feel that embrace of love, kindness, and generosity of God and you, my dear people, make that happen. Thank you for all you do.




