Sacrament of Matrimony

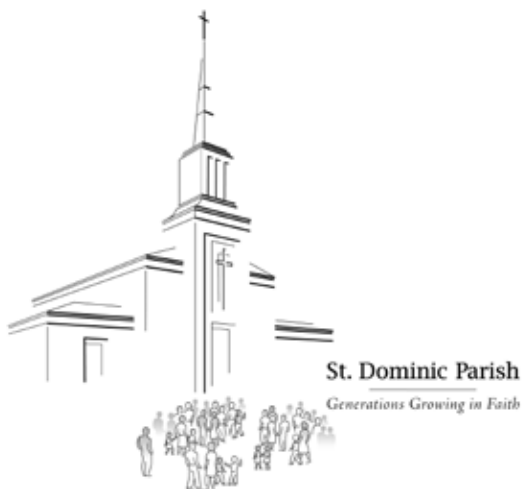
