COMMUNION FOR THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

Sacrament of Matrimony

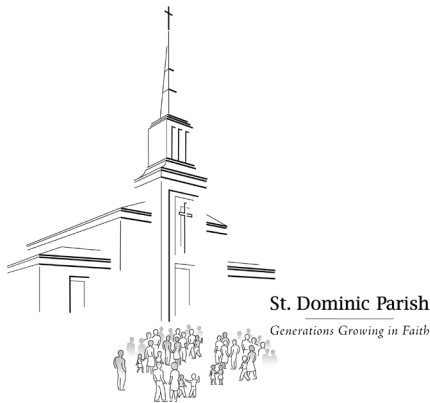
