
BREAKING OPEN THE WORD SESSIONS

One Faith, One Hope, One Love

One Faith, One Hope, One Love is an historic endeavor that will help secure the future of the Church for many generations. St. Dominic will receive 20% of all funds collected up until our parish goal, and then 60% of all funds will return to St. Dominic after we surpass our goal.

The parish share will be used to establish a St. Dominic only scholarship endowment for tuition assistance and parish education programs. The growth of the fund will provide the scholarships to the children of St. Dominic for years into the future.

Here at St. Dominic, our goal is **\$1,280,000** to be raised over a 5 year period of time. I am happy to report that currently we have already received **\$364,160** from only **57** gifts! Through the hard work of many volunteers, we are now at **28%** of our goal with an average gift of **\$6,389**. Thank you to all of you who have made this effort such a success so far!
