SIGN OF PEACE AND COMMUNION FROM THE CUP DURING FLU SEASON

ANOTHER WAY TO SUPPORT ST. DOMINIC

Are you age 70 and a half and required by the IRS to take annual distributions from your IRA account, also known as Required Minimum Distributions (RMD)? If so, you may consider making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA account directly to St. Dominic Parish. QCDs will satisfy your annual distribution requirement, (RMD), and will not be included in your taxable income for the year. This could be a great way to save taxes and financially support St. Dominic Parish.
